

Seeds of Faith

On Sunday, February 15 and 18, 2015 The Evangelism Committee, using the resources of the Endowment Fund will encourage members to participate in an exciting new ministry called Sharing Seeds of Faith. The purpose of this initiative is to give adults and children an opportunity to use a \$10 gift to find creative ways to serve others or "give a hand up". We want adults and children to imagine how God equips them to evangelize.



Here's how it will work:

Near the end of the worship service on Sunday, February 15, 2015, Pastor Rob Myallis will bless the envelopes that contain a ten dollar bill and instructions on how to participate. Pastor will pray that this "seed money" will inspire and equip each adult and child to reflect on their specific God-given gifts and use those gifts with the help of the ten dollar "seed money" in order to fulfill an unmet need of their "neighbor(s)," whether within the immediate community or across the world. Ushers will distribute "seed money" envelopes after the worship service on Sunday February 15 and Wednesday Feb 18, 2015.

"Seed money" recipients may work alone or collaborate with others in order to do something simple, small, big, or complex. Be creative. A few examples of how to show God cares for "neighbor(s)' might be:

- (a) Make notebooks and send them (along with envelopes, postage, and pens) to juvenile delinquency centers;
- (b) Make CD's of songs, jokes, and encouraging stories or sayings and send them to a children's hospital or agency that serves children.
- (c) Look for an elderly neighbor that may be lonely or in need of transportation or personal care items. And may we say again, BE CREATIVE!

Then on April 19, immediately following worship, everyone will be invited to our Annual Jim Northridge Spaghetti Miracle. This is where we each bring a jar of sauce and a box of pasta. Some of the donations will be used to make the meal and the remainder will be given to JOY. After lunch, we will ask the members to share with the group how they used their "seed money". We will celebrate and thank God for equipping adults and children to discover and implement surprising ways to evangelize and encourage members to let this be a continuing ministry.

We encourage participants to share what they are doing during Lent with the world by using the hashtag #SeedsOfFaithZions2015.



...Serving at Zion's Today

Have you ever noticed that list of names in your bulletin titled "Serving at Zion's Today" and wondered who those people are and what those jobs involve? Over the next few months, we will tell you about each job and how you could be involved.

#1 **LECTOR** - This is another name for some one who reads the lessons from the "lectionary." For us, this involves reading one, usually fairly short bible story and being the leader in the responsive reading of a Psalm (you read a verse, the congregation reads a verse). Anyone who can read out loud is welcome to be a lector. Once you express interest, the coordinator will contact you and schedule a Sunday for you. A few weeks before your day to read, you will be given a copy of the lessons so you can read them ahead of time. Another copy will be on the lecturn (the podium from which you read) on that Sunday morning. We have several lectors, so each one reads only a few times a year. If you find this interesting, you can contact Ken Hess or Noel Strattan to volunteer.
