Zion's Mission Statement: Reflecting Christ, we are called to share God's gifts

Holy Week: Generosity in the extreme

This Lent we have focused on generosity as spiritual discipline. The parables of Jesus have challenged us to consider what generosity looks like in our life; the Seeds of Faith project has provided a means to practice generosity. During Holy Week, we take a break from reflection on our generosity; instead we turn to contemplate and experience the generosity of God. We recall how God withheld nothing from us, even giving his Son to suffer, die and rise. We hope and pray this Holy Week that the Good -- the generous! -- News of Jesus Christ will come to you.

We begin on **Palm Sunday** (March 29, 10:30 AM) celebrating Jesus entry into Jerusalem. We will have a procession of Palm branches and shout, "Hosanna," just like the people in Jerusalem did 2,000 years ago to welcome Jesus as their King.

We will gather again for **Joyful Spirits on Wednesday** (April 1, 6:15 PM). This service will, as it did last year, offer children a chance to experience the mystery and even sadness of Holy Week. We know that the events of the week can be complex for children; this service puts things in a way that they (and everyone) can understand.

Next we will gather on **Maundy Thursday** (April 2, 7:00 PM). Our confirmation students will lead us in this worship service. This night we recall the Last Supper, betrayal and arrest of Jesus. In spite of all this tragedy, Jesus still offers them a new *mandate* (hence the word Maundy), that they celebrate this meal, this wine and bread, in remembrance of him. We obey Jesus' commandment and celebrate communion this night. We also remember his betrayal and strip the altar, visually reminding us of the suffering to come.

On **Good Friday** we remember the trial, suffering and death of Jesus on the cross. The community service is at the UCC church at Noon; we will also gather for worship at our church in the evening (April 3, 7:00 PM). This is the darkest day of the Christian year, yet we call it good because we know that on this day, Jesus did what none of us could do, namely, bear the sins and suffering of the world.

Finally we arrive at **Easter Morning**, ready to sing Alleluia! We arrive at the empty tomb and hear the amazing news that death has lost its sting! God has such a passion for us that he came back from the dead so that we could be reunited with him and all the saints forever. On Easter (April 5), we will have two services. The first is an early morning service at 7:00 AM. At 8:00 AM you can join us for breakfast; Sunday School at 9 AM will feature an Easter craft for children. At 10:30 AM, we will have a festive service of brass, organ and choirs.

Our Lenten fasting and discipline of generosity gives way to praising God for his abundant generosity. May Christ dwell richly in your hearts these days.

Social Hall and Christian Education Wing

Phase II Renovations

To celebrate our congregation's 275th anniversary in 2014, we prayerfully embarked on a series of renovations to our social hall and Christian education wing. The result has been a significantly improved social hall and kitchen area. From funeral luncheons, to Wednesday worship, to VBS, to job fairs, this renovated space has become a hub of fellowship, worship, learning and service. We rejoice at the ministry that happens each week in our Social Hall.

The financial support for these renovations has been overwhelming. The total cost to our church for these was about \$150,000. Through some estate gifts, grants from our church's endowment and each of your gifts, we have already raised roughly \$130,000! We are well ahead on our loan repayment. Thank you for your generosity.

Council is proposing a second phase of these renovations, aimed primarily at the Sunday School area. Council formed a committee last year to explore renovations to this area once we realized that our asbestos tile had become weakened. Council believed that if we needed to move all of our supplies and furnishings to replace the tile, we should explore what else needed repair. At this point, Council has identified three other projects that need attention and should be considered while we replace the tile.

- **Replacement of windows:** The insulation and seams around the downstairs windows need repair. The current windows are old and we would like to replace them with new and more efficient windows. We are proposing 16 double hung replacement windows, vinyl clad, low E-glass, and ½ screens. The replacement will include redoing the seams.
- Air Conditioning: The Sunday School, Preschool and Nursery areas become uncomfortably hot in the summer months. The reality is that to do ministry with young families today requires AC. Young families consider a non-air-conditioned facility not child friendly. We have spent a great deal of time and energy making this wing of the building attractive for ministry; it would be a shame to leave it virtually useless each summer. In addition, the AC. units have a heat pump, meaning we can have an alternative to the boiler room. This is especially valuable for times we do not want to use the entire boiler. Having the AC. will also help reduce mold, a previous problem in our basement.
- **Roof:** We have tried various repairs to the roof this winter to deal with the leaks. This Spring we have been fortunate not to have any further leaks. Council is looking into options to repair and seal the roof.

The total cost of these repairs will be between \$40-56K, depending on the roof. To pay for this we have three current sources of funding: A grant from the Endowment, a gift from the preschool, and cash which has been dedicated for the Social Hall Renovations. Based on these amounts, we will need to borrow funds to complete these projects. However, we are able to re-borrow from Thrivent Financial Bank what we have already paid back. This avoids many fees and keeps our beneficial terms. To put it another way, after these repairs are done, the church will still face the same loan costs. Currently our annual loan payments have been covered by a grant from the Endowment fund, allowing us to put surplus toward the principal. This has helped tremendously in chipping away at our debt.

At its April meeting Council will vote on a final proposal to bring before the congregation. This letter first, is to let you know what is being considered and second, to invite you to a <u>congregational meeting on Sunday, April 26, following the 10:30 AM worship service</u>.
