Growing in faith - in the summer time!

I'll admit it: Summer is not peak church attendance! Lots of people have summer vacations and trips that interrupt the normal flow of worship. Here are 12 ways you can continue to nurture faith in your life this summer, even amid travel and family vacations.

- <u>Watch our worship online</u>: Booked a Saturday to Saturday rental? Consider live-streaming our worship from Sunday morning! The service is available for viewing the next couple of the days.
- Worship in the park on Wednesday evenings: Away on the weekends? Join us the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month. We will have Joyful Spirits at the Pavilion at Jonestown Park. We've thought about having worship in the park for some time; with the construction at the church this summer, it seemed like the perfect time to get outside!
- <u>Vacation Bible School</u>: This year's theme is "Camp Discovery." We will start on Sunday, June 14, after worship service until 3 PM. We will then have VBS each morning from 9-11:30. Thursday, June 18 will be our last day. <u>This is also for adults -- we need helpers!</u>
- <u>Faith 5</u>: Faith 5 is simply way to do home devotions. Many families in our congregation use this method with their children, whether they are toddlers or teenagers. On Sunday, June 7, and Sunday, July 5, we will offer a Sunday School class time for families and children/youth to go over how to do this at home.
- <u>Bike and Bible</u>: During the Summer, our church has a Bike and Bible group that meets weekly. Keep your eyes open for info about this fun group!
- <u>Lutheran Summer Camp</u>: The Lutheran church in the area has two great summer camps, with all sorts of programs, including family camp (that the Myallis family is trying this summer)! The church subsidizes the cost, so consider this for your kids or whole family!
- <u>"By Heart" Challenge</u>: Led by Emily Myallis, this ministry challenges children and youth to some summer memory work. If successful, they can join everyone for a pool party celebration!
- <u>Summer music</u>: Consider sharing a musical gift this summer. This can be a great way to focus your own prayer life by preparing to sing or play for God in the summer.
- <u>Pastor's study in June</u>: Pastor Rob will lead a summer study on "What is different about Lutheran theology anyway?" By June he will have a more catchy title. Get ready!
- <u>Daily Devotions</u>: Get a daily devotional! The church offers books as well as an online app that has a daily devotional. There are plenty of online resources as well.
- <u>Mission Trip</u>: There are still other openings for the mission trip to do home construction and renovation in West Virginia!
- <u>Coloring Books</u>: When all else fails, pick up a Bible themed coloring book for yourself or your kids. Traffic jams happen. There are plenty of other artistic and creative crafts for your kids to do at home or on the road. You can find them on our Pinterest site! But again, when all else fails, a little coloring book for a road trip never hurt.

There is no substitute for worship, but we know that summer is a time of travel. Hopefully this list helps you fill in the gaps in worship. Your weekends might be full, but growing in faith can still be part of your summer!







During the off season, the Roman Holiday office is staffed only Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10 AM to 4 PM.

Members of Zion's group need only provide a one night deposit. When you receive your receipt and it states you owe an additional night deposit, ignore that. The balance is only due upon check in.

The only forms of payment at check-in are cash, Travelers Checks, certified checks, and credit cards. Note that there is a 3% surcharge if using a credit card when making a reservation or upon check-in. Personal checks (deposit and/or full payment) are permitted only if sent to them far enough in advance to clear the bank. Personal checks are not permitted to pay the balance at check-in.
