## *Zion's Mission Statement: Reflecting Christ, we are called to share God's gifts*

October: A Focus on God's Mission for Us

The Old Testament stories we have heard on Sunday mornings this September were fantastic: The Garden of Eden, God's visit to Abraham and Sarah and then Jacob wrestling with God. It has been a great way to launch our annual walk through of the Bible. Each week's Old Testament story, which has been the focus Bible story of the whole week's Bible studies and worship, has been powerful in its own way. They have also worked together to present us with an amazing image of God in the Bible: the Lord who creates us, saves us and sustains us through life.

I admit there has been something missing, namely, a focus on how to live as a Christian. (Ironically our focus Bible stories from the Old Testament have contained far more Gospel than Law!) Well, this emphasis is coming soon to a pulpit near you. Indeed, in October's focus Bible stories we will learn more about what it means to be a follower of Jesus. We will discover more deeply the mission we are on as a congregation -- to reflect Christ and share God's gifts. We will also discover more deeply the mission that God gives us each day, to love God and love our neighbors.

These stories present a variety of ways in which we can live our mission as Christians both on an individual and congregational level. A preview of what is to come:

Resist evil in the world: The first week of October, we will focus on the story of God calling Moses to confront Pharaoh. Moses will lead the Israelites out of slavery. We still have plenty of evil left in this world today -- sadly, including slavery and oppressive dictatorships. The call to love our neighbor means resisting evil, in our communities, in our nation and in our world.

Raise children in faith (Oct 5-11): This week we focus on the great words of Old Testament faith: "Hear O Israel, the Lord Your God is One." The people are told to teach this and other commandments to their children. One of the primary ways in which we can follow Jesus Christ is to help pass on our faith to the youngest generation.

Accompany the grieving (Oct 12-18): This week we focus on the story of Ruth, who chooses to accompany her mother-in-law after the death of their husbands. As Christians we are called to console those who grieve, for death, or for any reason. We are called to walk with them during this season of their life.

Praising the Lord (Oct 19-25): This week focus on the story of King David praising God. To be a Christian is to praise the living Lord! Giving thanks is not an optional part of living as a disciple! (For those that are curious what King David's praise has to do with the Lutheran Reformation of the Church, also celebrated that day...come and find out!)

These stories present a variety of ways for us to live our lives as Christians. God has saved us and sustained us for a purpose, for a mission, namely, to live as disciples of Jesus Christ, both now and forever. So come, worship and learn. Discover and be strengthened for your mission as a follower of Jesus Christ.

## **Record a Story for a child**

The Storybook Prison Ministry is looking for volunteers for its Lebanon County Correctional Facility program. This is organized by the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Churches of America (WELCA) and supported by Lebanon County Lutheran Churches.

Three times a year—around Easter, Labor Day, and Christmas, volunteers spend about two hours at the Lebanon prison recording incarcerated mothers reading a story to their children. Volunteers then transfer the recordings to CDs and send the CDs, together with the storybooks, to the children so that they may listen at home to the voice of their mothers reading a bedtime story. *I have been loved by members, learned from sermons and scripture, and heard songs of praise.*

*I have been soaked in God's love and come to you with blessings of hope and love from our congregation.*

The back of the tag gives the church's name, address, telephone number, web site address, and Facebook page, and asks the bear owner to drop us a line to let us know what receiving the bear has meant to them. The cost of each bear is \$10.00, which will sustain the ministry. You are welcome to take a bear directly from the window sills. Highlights from September 10, 2015 Council Meeting:

- Pastor's Rob explained how his fellowship through Chautauqua has provided him with new energy and insights for ministry in our congregation. Given the truly unique and challenging pastoral care situations of this summer, a long break was especially helpful for Pastor Rob.
- Summer giving was exceptionally low. Council and Stewardship committee are looking at both short and long term ways to encourage better and more consistent giving. The October council retreat will touch on this issue.
- The Sunday School wing renovations are complete. We thank Deb Reiner and many others who worked on this project. We also thank the various ministries for their efforts in post-construction set-up for the fall ministry season. The Preschool is full and has been enjoying the ability to use air conditioning this hot fall. At the October committee night meeting (Oct 1) a discussion will be held about how to utilize this space for ministry next summer.
- Mutual Ministry committee is meeting in September to look at how our church maintains job descriptions, gives performance evaluations, and encourages staff growth of our non-pastoral staff.

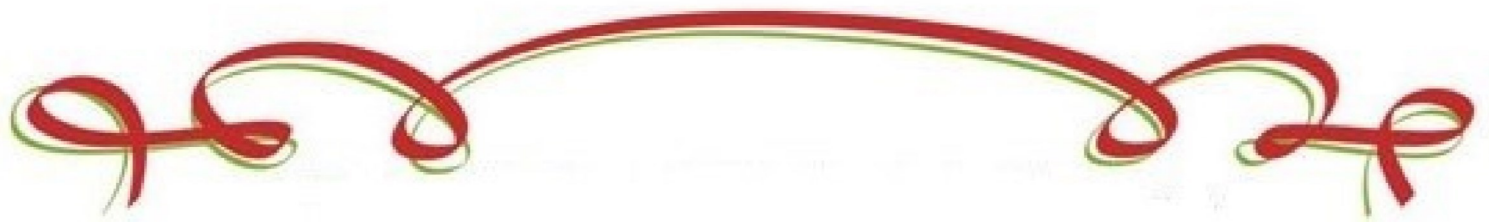

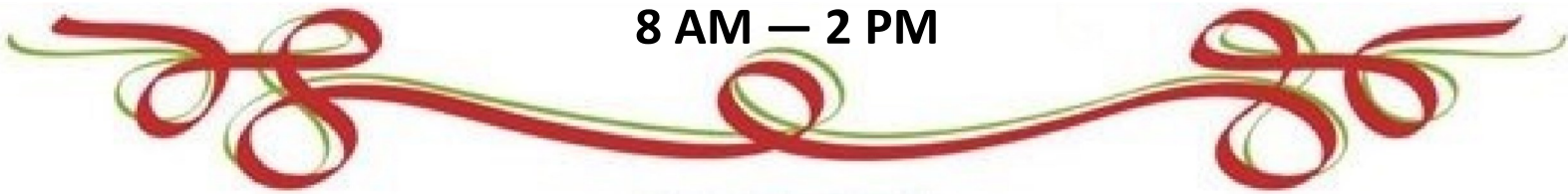
