Zion's Mission Statement: Reflecting Christ, we are called to share God's gifts

During the past few weeks, I have begun reflecting back on my time at Zion's. It has been a wonderful eight years. While I have much sadness about leaving, the primary emotion I have been experiencing is thankfulness. I am supremely grateful to God for the opportunity to have served as pastor at this point in my life and the life of the congregation. I would like to share some of the reasons why I am thankful.

First, I am thankful for your embrace of my family. With great fondness, I remember the baby shower held at the 2008 church picnic. Over the years you all continued to shower my family with great affection, be it at church events, in the community or at your home. My family will always treasure the love we experienced from the congregation. I believe that the congregation fulfilled the promises made to our daughters on the day of their Baptisms to help raise them in Christian faith.

I am also thankful for the willingness of you to say "yes" to Jesus' call to serve your neighbor through this church. Time and time again you said "yes" to assuming new responsibilities for ministries in this church (cherub choir director, preschool volunteer, committee chair...the list goes on and on!). Often people were not sure if they could do it, but they gave it a try. God equips those whom God calls; it has been a great blessing to see people grow in faith, hope and love through their service to the church.

Time and time again you -- not just individuals, but the whole church -- said "yes", as we boldly stepped forward in mission. We took a number of "faith leaps" over the years: starting a midweek service and expanding it to a full meal; launching a preschool; buying the neighboring property; hosting an intern; renovating the Sunday School and Social Hall (again the list goes on and on!). I give thanks for your willingness to follow the call of God. I attribute this to the work of the Holy Spirit in your hearts. I particularly give thanks to the church council members who took the opportunity to make their time on council about growing in spiritual leadership. I have witnessed council members grow in faith and grow together as a group. The strength of our council allowed us to navigate these changes so smoothly.

I also thank the congregation for allowing me to become involved in the community. I tried to be as public of a leader as possible, showing that I and more importantly, the church cares about the community. I became aware that even if I were not wearing my clerics (pastor clothes) I still represented our congregation. My experience taught me that a pastor can make a tremendous impact on a community. My experience also taught me that this congregation cares about this community.

What I most cherish is the way in which as a pastor I was given permission to be a part of your life. I have been with you for some of the great high points of your life; I have also witnessed some of the darkest times of your lives. Through it all I saw God at work, bearing your toils and raising you up to new life. At times serving as a pastor in this capacity was overwhelming, but I profoundly cherished this role and calling as a pastor in your life. My greatest sadness about leaving is that I will no longer be your shepherd in this way. I know God will send you another faithful shepherd; the congregation has many shepherds in it already, who offer care and guidance. But I will miss deeply being your pastor. I thank you for your care and openness to the ministry God provided for me to do here.

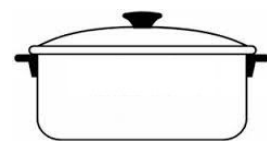

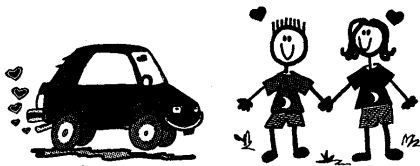
