A Message from Pastor Wayne Moritz

The weather is warming. Lawn mowers are humming. Gardens and flower beds are springing up. Graduates are walking across the stage. Vacations at the shore or in the mountains no longer seem so far away. Summer must be getting close.

Right around Memorial Day church life takes on a new routine. A different rhythm to life and ministry sets in. Sunday School gives way to Vacation Bible School. Worship times often move to earlier in the day or get combined into a single service. Preachers and choir members shed their robes if there's no AC in the sanctuary. Mission trips set out to various parts of the country and the church picnic brings out people's favorite side-dishes and desserts.

The summer season has set in. No appointed color like the purple of Lent or white of Christmas. No set duration, just whenever we want to start things up after Labor Day. Summer changes us, shifting around how we gather and what we do.

But that's to be expected. We need our seasons. Even the first disciples did.

St. Luke tells us Jesus called His twelve friends together and told them to get away for awhile (Luke 9:1-6). They had been in His company for a long time and He felt they needed a change of pace. So He sent them out into the community. Perhaps some to the shore, some to the mountains. Galilee had both. He also directed them to travel in pairs as some company is always good. Scripture doesn't say how long they were away. It could have been a long weekend or a couple of weeks or a three month sabbatical. They all came back, though, full of excitement and stories. As St. Luke puts it, "on their return the Apostles told Jesus all they had done" (v.10).

I think the summer presents us with a similar opportunity. To do a little traveling. To enjoy some good company. To experience some new things. To fashion some interesting stories to share which, when September rolls around, I'm sure we'll have.

Yet as this new season begins to unfold and lead us forth in a variety of directions, let's live it like Peter, Matthew, John, and the rest of the disciples did - with the words of Jesus fresh in our hearts and minds.

"Proclaim the Kingdom," He said (v.2). Sure we can talk about how the yard is doing or our current home improvement project. Of course, we can discuss the latest ball scores. But make sure to share your faith when given the opportunity. And they will arise. Often unscripted. Sometimes requested, sometimes not. But you have Good News to share that can lift a person's spirit or let the Son shine through on a cloudy day. In you and your faith, God's Kingdom is near.

Make sure "to heal" people, He added (v.2). Don't worry, none of the first twelve were doctors and you don't have to be either. Yet sitting down with a neighbor on their backyard deck, sharing a burger and an ice tea, and listening as they pour out their worries about their Mom or Dad or kids can do more good than you can imagine. Staying in touch with your buddy going through hard rounds of chemo or counseling can do the same. Your simple presence and kindness can strengthen and restore people's well-being.

And "take nothing for your journey" this summer, Jesus concluded (v.4), except the really important stuff which boils down to time. Time to worship - here at Zion's or wherever you might be traveling. Time to stay fresh in Scripture - together with a friend or study group or by yourself a little each day. And time to pray - opening your heart to God in thanksgiving or concern, spontaneously or as planned. God promises you "power" (v.1) to do incredible things as you go on your way this summer. Take time everyday to let that power flow into you, renewing your faith, filling you with love.

Summer changes us, but gifts us with new occasions to experience and share the Good News. As summer rolls around at Zion's, embrace those possibilities. It might be at Vacation Bible School or Joyful Spirits worship in the park. It might be at the shore retreat or on the mission trip. It might be nestled in your pew for Sunday worship or sitting at the ballpark with your buddy. It might be with family around your kitchen table at home or with people in line for a table some Friday night at the diner.

Summer is here. Let's go with it. Jesus sends us forth with power and purpose. In Christ, Pastor Wayne

EVANGELISM COMMITTEE OUTREACH - TLC FOR REFUGEES—PERSONAL-CARE KITS NEEDED

It's in the news almost every day--terrified families fleeing their homelands because of violence or natural disasters. Lutheran World Relief (LWR) is helping these refugees as they struggle to survive in makeshift camps in foreign lands. Zion's would like to aid in this worthy cause by providing TLC (The Love of Christ) Refugee Personal-Care Kits. We are asking members of the congregation if they will prepare a Refugee Kit, put it in a plastic bag, and place the bag in one of the baskets. Here is a list of the items requested for each kit:

- 1 towel. It should be between 20" x 40" to 27" x 52" and be light/medium weight as recipients hand wash the towels and hang to dry.
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of individually wrapped soaps to total 9 ounces.
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging.
- 1 sturdy comb.
- 1 metal nail clippers (attached file optional).

Before we mail the kits, LWR will send us a special barcode so that we can track the kits on the computer and know the location of the refugees who will be receiving them. Place in basket in gathering area by <u>July 31!</u>

Please help us to reach our goal of 50 kits.
