A Message from Pastor Caitlin

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

God's grace and peace be with you this day! The month of November is nearly here—probably one of my favorite months of the year. I love the crispness of fall, the promise and purpose of the holidays that bookmark this month—All Saints Day, Thanksgiving, and the beginning of Advent—and the solemn significance of Veterans Day. November is also when you and I get to exercise our right to vote, a privilege that is core to who we are as Americans, and one we dare not take for granted. November, in other words, is full of good, hope-filled occasions. And, yet, it is likely to be a difficult month for our nation.

On November 8 we will elect a President, members of Congress, and state government leaders, after one of the most divisive and hate-filled campaign seasons in a long, long time. As I said in worship, no matter who is elected, there will be people in our congregation, families, communities, schools, and workplaces for whom it will feel as though the world is coming to a crashing end. No matter who is elected, there will be passionate reactions, and, likely, accusations of corruption. But no matter who is elected, the days will roll on—November 9, 10, 11...Inauguration Day, January 20...and so on and so forth—and we will have to move forward. No matter who is elected, we—as a congregation, as a community, and as a nation—will still have to live together, work together, and share a common life together. The vitriol of this season won't go away overnight—decades of distrust and discontent have led us to this point—but, day by day, step by step, we will have to move forward.

But here's the Good News: We believe in Jesus Christ, and we worship Him as our one true King. Jesus was born to save sinners, including you and me, and to reconcile all things in heaven and on earth. Through Jesus, we have peace with God, and with Jesus, we can have peace with our enemies. In His life, death, and resurrection, Jesus teaches us how to move forward on November 9 because Jesus teaches us how to live each and every day. No matter who is elected, we will still be called to live out our baptismal vocation by: loving our enemies and praying for those who hate us; speaking the truth in love; engaging in empathetic and compassionate dialogue with people with whom we disagree; seeing each other and the stranger on the street as fellow human beings created in God's image; and seeking the welfare of our neighbor. No matter who is elected, our primary citizenship will still be in heaven (Philippians 3:20), and Jesus Christ will still be our King.

As Lutheran Christians, we undoubtedly believe we are called to participate in the political system—government is one way that God works to restrain evil, preserve creation, and build a more peaceful and just social order in a sinful world. So, please, if you are eligible and registered, get out and vote on November 8. But, even more, pray for our nation, our candidates, our elected officials, and our enemies. Pray that we, the body of Christ, might live out our baptismal vocation as we move forward in the days and weeks to come, that in our words and actions, the world might know that no matter who is elected there is indeed a Way to move forward, and that is the Way of love and grace.

What is AmazonSmile?

When you shop at smile.amazon.com, you'll find the exact same low prices, vast selection and convenient shopping experience as Amazon.com, with the added bonus that Amazon will donate a portion of the purchase price to your favorite charitable organization. You can choose from nearly one million organizations to support.

How do I shop at AmazonSmile?

To shop at AmazonSmile simply go to smile.amazon.com from the web browser on your computer or mobile device. You may also want to add a bookmark to smile.amazon.com to make it even easier to return and start your shopping at AmazonSmile.

Which products on AmazonSmile are eligible for charitable donations?

Tens of millions of products on AmazonSmile are eligible for donations. You will see eligible products marked "Eligible for AmazonSmile donation" on their product detail pages. Recurring Subscribe-and-Save purchases and subscription renewals are not currently eligible.

Can I use my existing account on AmazonSmile?

How do I select a charitable organization to support when shopping on AmazonSmile?

We will remember your selection, and then every eligible purchase you make at smile.amazon.com will result in a donation. You can change your charity any time.

How much of my purchase does Amazon donate?

The AmazonSmile Foundation will donate 0.5% of the purchase price from your eligible AmazonSmile purchases. The purchase price is the amount paid for the item minus any rebates and excluding shipping & handling, gift-wrapping fees, taxes, or service charges.

Can I receive a tax deduction for amounts donated from my purchases on AmazonSmile?

Donations are made by the AmazonSmile Foundation and are not tax deductible by you.

NEW Process for Expense Reimbursements We are re-introducing a revised Expense Form for all purchases made on Zion's credit cards, charged to store accounts, or purchased by members for reimbursement. These revised forms will ask for the purchaser's name, items purchased, and receipts, and will need the approval signature of the committee chairperson for which the item was purchased or charged. If the committee chairperson makes the purchase, the Expense Form needs to the approval signature of Pastor Caitlin or the Council President. These forms are available in the Treasurer's Mailbox (outside of the Church Office) and *must be completed for any purchases made or charged*. The completed forms can be returned to the same location with receipts attached. This process will ensure that items get charged to the proper line item in our budget, and will also provide oversight of all purchases made on behalf of Zion's. Questions? The next month is a very full time in the worship life of Zion's. Most of it occurs within the normal setting of the 10:30 Sunday and 6:15 Wednesday worship services, but there are a few other opportunities for you to join us in various celebrations. (But first, the last Sunday in October)

October 30 - Reformation Sunday - This is the Sunday when we traditionally celebrate the centrality of the Gospel to our faith and pray that God will continually renew and unite all Christians. This year it is also the opening of a year long celebration of 500 years of evangelical reformation. You will see much more about this throughout the year. You are invited to wear RED!

♦ You are invited back at 4:00 PM for the **Service of Installation** for the Reverend Caitlin Glass as pastor of Zion's. This is a celebration of our new journey together. Reception will follow.

November 6 - All Saints Sunday -This Sunday we celebrate all the people of God, living and dead, who form the eternal body of Christ. In particular, we will recognize those who were baptized this year and those who have died this year. We will also celebrate the people in our lives who have helped us develop our faith.

November 13 - 26th Sunday after Pentecost - The readings this day remind us that though the end is near, the baptized know how to live in the "meantime." We are strengthened for the living of these days in word and sacrament. We will also honor Veterans and active service members this day, and join together in prayer for our nation.

November 20 - Christ the King Sunday - On this last Sunday of the church year, we celebrate Christ's victory over death and the coming of his Kingdom in our lives and in our world. Today's readings recall Jesus' execution between two criminals. It appears so utterly contradictory that the king should be crucified with the outlaws, yet through the gate of death our Lord opens the door to paradise. We will celebrate how Christ's kingship teaches us how to love and serve our neighbor.

Wednesday, November 23 - Thanksgiving Eve 7:00 PM - Community service at Zions, with communion. Together we give thanks for all the blessing of the year. (No Joyful Spirits, King's Kids, or Bible study)

November 27 - The First Sunday of Advent - Happy New Year! Advent is the four Sundays before Christmas. It is the time we prepare for the coming of the Christ - both his first coming as a child in Bethlehem, and his anticipated Second Coming. Our theme is "God on the Way." Advent is the way towards Christmas, but, more importantly, Advent (expectation) as a way of "being" during this time before Christ's return. Home devotions are a emphasized during this season. We will have a wreath-making event with lunch right after service. Devotionals will be provided for both families and adult households. Come worship with us and celebrate!




