A Message from Pastor Caitlin

God's grace and peace to you this day!

I've been saying for a few weeks that no matter who is elected to public office on November 8, some people will be sorely disappointed, some will be overwhelmed with joy, and many will be somewhere in between. We've witnessed this reality in the days since our election, and will continue to live into it in the weeks and months to come. No matter where *we fall* in this continuum of emotion, as people of faith we are still called to live out our baptismal vocation by worshiping God as Lord. We are still called to love our enemies, pray for those who hate us, speak the truth in love, engage in dialogue with people with whom we disagree, and seek to see each other and the stranger on the street as fellow human beings created in God's image. We are called to pray for our leaders, seek the welfare of our neighbor, and shine God's light of love in the world. Our Christian call to love and serve has not, and will not, change.

The season of Advent—a season of *hope* and *expectation*—is a *gift* to us and our neighbors in these times. During these four weeks as we wait in the 'now but not yet' tension of our faith we give thanks that God has already come to earth in the form of a babe born in Bethlehem some 2000 years ago even as we long for Christ's return to earth. Through our Advent Sermon Series, "God on the Way", scripture will point us to a God who is *already* present "On the Way" of our daily lives, offering joy and peace and forgiveness, as well as a God who promises to still be "On the Way" toward us, continually breaking into our world in new, powerful, and hope-filled ways. Specifically, we'll look at what it means to "Wait on the Way" (November 27), experience "Peace on the Way" (December 4), seek "Healing on the Way" (December 11, with the rite of healing offered), live in "Hope on the Way" (December 18), and celebrate "Jesus as the Way" (December 24)

If you hunger and thirst for Good News this season, know that your family members, neighbors, and co-workers do too. Invite them to worship with you at Zion's this Advent and Christmas season, on either Sunday mornings or Wednesday nights. When the store lines get long, and the to-do lists longer, you may find that mid-week worship is just the piece of peace you need. General Information:

- Advent Devotionals for families will be available again this year. We will have them available for families attending the Advent Wreath making event, Wednesday nights and at Sunday school. They will also be on the window sill across from the church office, in the stair well, or near where Pastor Caitlin greets people after worship. This year the Advent devotional for families is <u>Sing a Song for Christmas</u>, which includes making a paper chain to help count the days to Christmas! <u>Advent See-Son</u> will be the devotional for teens and young adults. In Acts 2, it says, "All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need."

"Serving at Zion's Today" ...

Have you ever noticed that list of names in your bulletin and wondered how you could become one of them? Any time is a good time to consider how you can become involved in worship at Zion's for the coming year. We have opportunities for all ages. All participation is on a rotating basis, so the frequency of service depends upon the number of people doing each job. The following are brief descriptions of the various ways to serve during service.

Acolyte

An acolyte is someone whose job is to light the altar candles and help with communion and offering. Symbolically they serve to remind us that Jesus Christ is the light of the world. Anyone in grades 4-confimation is welcome to be an acolyte. Acolytes are provided training in their responsibilities and are paired with a more experienced acolyte until they are familiar with the role. Anyone who can follow directions is welcome to serve. Acolytes serve in pairs and are rotated on a weekly basis based on the number of volunteers. Crucifer

A crucifer is someone who carries a cross. For us, this involves leading the procession at the beginning and end of the service. Symbolically, the procession is indicative of the Christian life, following Christ wherever he leads – into the sanctuary to worship and out into the world to serve. Our crucifer also helps serve communion, by refilling the chalices (the wine cups) from the flagon (the large pitcher of wine) as needed. Any adult or confirmed youth who can carry the cross is eligible to be a crucifer. Crucifers serve one week at a time.
