A Message from Pastor Caitlin

What is Lent? Parents and children will be exploring this question through interactive stations on Sunday, March 5 (the first Sunday of Lent) during the Sunday School hour in the Social Hall. They will mark each other with ashen crosses, anoint their hands with oil, hear about the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, pray for one another, and make pretzels (which were invented by monks as an instrument of prayer). They will explore Lenten themes of prayer, repentance, almsgiving, worship, and fasting. All are welcome to join us for this interfaith learning experience.

What is Lent? Children aren't the only ones who ask this question! Every year as I meet with colleagues to plan Lent activities and worship, we ask each other "What is Lent? What Gospel message do we most need to hear *this Lent*? How do we make this message come alive in the congregations we serve? You see, Lent is a lot of things: it is a time of confession (admitting to the wrong we do, and the good we fail to do) and repentance (changing our ways). It is a time of fasting (giving up) and almsgiving (giving forward). It is a time of reflection and prayer as we prepare to celebrate the death and resurrection of our Lord.

What is Lent? Lent is also a time for spiritual and relational growth—with God, one another, and our community. As you know, Zion's is embarking on an ambitious endeavor—to complete 40 Thrivent Action Team projects during the 40 days of Lent. These projects, led by members and friends of Zion's will serve a variety of purposes in our local and global community. Through service, education, and fundraising for community organizations, we will seek to share God's abundant life and love with the world. As we work, serve, and learn together, we will grow deeper in relationship with one another, and experience God who is revealed in places of need and vulnerability. (It's not too late to apply for a Thrivent Action Team Project, or share a project idea—see me or Jim Gill if you need help!)

Because Lent is a time for spiritual and relational growth, we are launching two new opportunities for faith and fellowship this month: a new Sunday School class particularly to support and strengthen parents, and a

Young Adult group that will meet periodically for fellowship, learning, and service. Both are ideal events to invite friends and neighbors to, and great ways to get to know other members of our community.

Of course, worship is central to all faith growth. During Lent, we will continue to gather weekly for Word and Sacrament at 10:30 AM Sunday mornings. Soup suppers will happen every Wednesday at 5:30 PM, followed by Joyful Spirits at 6:15 PM, King's Kids at 6:45 PM and Holden Evening Prayer with guided study and meditation at 6:45 PM. In the midst of all the chaos swirling around in our homes and world, let us take *make* time for worship, reflection, and prayer. May God bless our Lenten journey.

Have you ever noticed that list of names in your bulletin titled "Serving at Zion's Today" and wondered how you could become one of them? Any time is a good time to consider how you can become involved in worship at Zion's. We have opportunities for all ages. The following are brief descriptions of some ways to serve during service.

Elevette Operator

The elevette operator is a volunteer who arrives about 30 minutes before a church service and uses a key to operate the small elevator in the church for members of the congregation who need it. The individual is also needed for approximately 10 minutes after the end of church to operate the elevette to assist congregants to the main floor again. There is minimal operator training needed to serve in this capacity. Rotation of service would depend on your availability and willingness to serve. Greeter

This is someone who stands at the bottom of the stairs that lead to the sanctuary on a Sunday morning and greets congregants on their way to worship. Several Zion's members have already been approved to lead Action Teams during Lent. Ideas have come from many






Last call for tickets! Mark Cable concert, Friday March 17 at 7:00pm in the Social Hall
