#### A Message from Pastor Caitlin

The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? (Psalm 27:1)

God's grace and peace to you this day! As I write this, I am T-5 days away from my Holy Land pilgrimage. Amid the packing piles, to-do lists, and background books, I'm filled with both excitement and fear. I've wanted to go to Israel for about a decade now and this trip is a near-perfect opportunity to fulfill that dream. But traveling to the Middle East isn't without potential sticky points, especially for people (like me) who don't consider themselves "travelers" in the first place.

And so I consider it a God-incidence (as opposed to a coincidence) that Psalm 27 is the appointed reading for Sunday. *The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?...For he will hide me in his shelter in the day of trouble; he will conceal me under the cover his tent; he will set me high on a rock.* What words of promise and peace!

No matter the century, no matter the place, no matter the challenges that surround, since the beginning of time there have been a million and one reasons to despair, two million and three reasons to fear. Which is why, since the beginning of time, God has shined Light into the darkness, Light that cannot and will not be overcome. In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God...what came into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people (John 1:1, 4). Throughout our lives, we experience times when we are surrounded by great and glorious Light, as well as times when it feels as though darkness is all that exists. Knowing this, Jesus created the Church to be "the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden" (Matthew 5:14). In good times and bad, we are called together to be the Church: to receive Christ's light as it shines through worship, scripture, and the presence of one another, and to share Christ's light in a world that is hungry for hope. In this season after Epiphany, may we continue to share God's gifts by inviting others to experience hope in and through Zion's: invite a friend or neighbor to join you for worship, or Wednesday night Bible study and community meal, or Lunch Bunch, or Lunch N Learn with Luther, or any of the many other opportunities listed in this newsletter. Each of these, alone, may only provide a glimmer of Light, but when the darkness closes in, even a single candle lights up a room with its glow.



## Worship

Have you ever noticed that list of names in your bulletin titled "Serving at Zion's Today" and wondered how you could become one of them? Any time is a good time to consider how you can become involved in worship at Zion's for the coming year. We have opportunities for all ages. All participation is on a rotating basis, so the frequency of service depends upon the number of people doing each job. The following are brief descriptions of the various ways to serve during service.

#### Altar Guild

Someone who serves on altar guild is responsible for setting up for and cleaning up after the sacraments. Altar guild prepares the chancel area and all of the worship related resources within it for worship. This preparation includes changing the paraments, the hymn boards, and filling candles with oil. However, the primary job is to make sure the bread/wafers and wine/juice are ready for communion. For baptism, altar guild fills the font and ensures the bibs and candles are ready. During festivals of the church, additional items including banners, flowers, extra candles, as well as additional services will need attention. The time commitment needed to serve is 1/2 - 1 hour of cleaning and setup time late in the week (time varies on whether there are paraments to change or things to be polished). Additional commitment time is coming early enough to put out the bread/wafers and wine/juice Sunday morning, and about 15 - 20 minutes to clean up after the service. How often you are serve depends upon how many groups we have functioning at the time. Altar guild works as a set of 2 people at a time. #### **Communion Assistant**

A communion assistant is someone who assists Pastor by serving wine during communion. This is done by pouring the wine from the chalice and declaring the promise "This is the blood of Christ shed for you" for each communicant who presents a cup. Communion assistant also offers both communion elements to the pastor after the congregation is finished communing. This occurs once every other month. Training will be provided to anyone who would like to serve in this capacity. #### **Acolyte**

An acolyte is a youth (grades 3-8) who lights the candles on the altar at the beginning of worship and extinguishes them at the end of worship. Over 60 members of our congregation have access to Thrivent Action Teams. By using this program, Zion's

members could secure up to \$10,000 of support (40 Action Teams x \$250 each). Consider the generosity and outreach that we could create if each of us led just one Action Team during Lent!



JANUARY NEWSLETTER FROM LUKE SWANSON, OUR SPONSORED YAGM MISSIONARY IN ARGENTINA Hello Friends,

It has now been over four months since I left the United States and arrived in Argentina, and almost four months since I arrived at my placement site. The time certainly is flying by and at times I struggle to keep up with how all the things that are going on here. This time has been an extremely eventful, exciting, and tiring process. I know I said the exact same thing two months ago in my last newsletter and I'll probably say the same thing in the next one as well. Some things will just never change no matter where I will be in this year long journey. The truth is, I do not see this whole YAGM process getting any easier. The more I learn, the more that is expected of me. This is the foundation of any work experience, but it proves just the more tiring in a country where the direction and the pace is still very foreign to me. Despite the experience being just as challenging as it has ever been, the fulfillment I have at the end of the day is as rewarding as ever.

There are numerous differences that I am experiencing here in Argentina. Spending the end of 2016 in the southern hemisphere is a challenge in itself. Whereas in the United States, we predominantly associate November and December with important holidays, the southern hemisphere is doing just the same but rushing around wrapping up all that that they need to do in their work, family, and personal lives, before they begin their summer vacations. Imagine all the work we do before going on vacation and then combine all of that chaos with the commercialized Christmas season.

The temperature is one of the most iconic factors that has made this time especially interesting. Never in my life have I gone to church on Christmas Eve wearing shorts and a t-shirt. Not only does this make up the biggest difference physically between my hemispherical experiences during the holidays, it challenges what I understand to be the Christmas atmosphere. Much of the Christmas songs we sing speak of a quiet winter night with gentle snow. That image is completely irrelevant here. A couple months ago, somebody asked me how I was doing and whether there was anything that I wanted or needed. I told them that what I really wanted was a snowy Christmas. I knew it would be impossible, but it was nonetheless what I really wanted at that time. At that point I began thinking of what I really wanted and what I really needed during this incredibly difficult time to be away from home. Knowing that being away from home for Christmas really makes you want to be with family, I began to realize that what I really needed was a family to be around. At that time I was unaware of how much support I would be getting from my host community. There was so much love pouring out at me that I had to decline several invitations for Christmas as I had already accepted the invitation to spend Christmas with my pastor.

It was very difficult declining invitations to spend Christmas with people who I have grown so close to, specifically those at El Arca, who have made it abundantly clear that birthdays, anniversaries, and holidays are a cause for great joy and a time where we can celebrate as a community. Nonetheless, I very much enjoyed spending Christmas at my pastor's house. Not only was this a great opportunity to get away, it provided me with the opportunity to better understand him, his family, and his friends. It was also great to be able to spend some time outside in his garden, taking in the warm summer air in the midst of the chaos that is Buenos Aires.

I am now entering what will be a fairly quiet time during my YAGM year. Many of the residents in my house have left permanently or for long stays with their families over the summer. I have time away from my placement site, which will mean less confident interaction with people I have grown close to and have provided that social interaction that an introvert like me often desperately needs. Nonetheless, it provides some much-needed time for rest. I trust that God will be by my side through this major shift in my experience, and will guide to greater understanding in how to proceed with much more confidence when my work resumes in a month's time.
