A Message from Pastor Caitlin

Dear friends in Christ: Holy Week will be here before we know it. For centuries, Christians have used this week to especially remember that the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus are historical events with great significance for Jesus' disciples. It is my hope and prayer that we would orient our hearts, minds, *and schedule* towards the important events of this week, making worship a priority, so that we experience the breadth and depth of the Good News shared with the world in the Last Supper, crucifixion, and resurrection. Here is an overview of the week's themes. Specifics about Zion's Holy Week worship are available later in the newsletter.

Palm Sunday- Before Jesus was crucified, he rode into Jerusalem on a donkey to the praises of a huge crowd. People honored him by laying down palm branches and coats before him, fulfilling a prophecy from Zechariah that our king come to us "humble and riding on a donkey" (Zechariah 9:9) We enter Holy Week praising our King with Hosannas just as the people praised Jesus 2,000 years ago. However, we also remember on this day that it wasn't long until the people's cries changed from "hosanna" to "crucify him."

Maundy Thursday – Thursday is when Jesus celebrated the Passover with his disciples, taught them to celebrate the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion), and washed their feet. We call this day "*Maundy*" (Latin for 'commandment') Thursday because Jesus also issued a new commandment this night: teaching his disciples to "*Love one another, as he loves us*" (*John 13:34*). After dinner that night, Jesus is betrayed by Judas, arrested, and put on trial.

Good Friday - This is the day Jesus foretold throughout His ministry, the day Jesus suffers and dies at the hands of men. Why do we call this day 'Good'? Because in this act God demonstrates God's unending perfect love for the world, showing us *just how much* God loves us. We remember this day with solemn contemplation, but also with hope because we know this isn't the end of God's story.

Easter Sunday – Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! We celebrate Jesus' triumph over death and the devil with all the "alleluias" we can exclaim for this is the most beautiful day, and promise, of our faith. Death does not have the final word, for Christ is risen! Through Christ, we, too, will be raised from the dead to live with God forever. And with Christ, we have hope for all the challenges we face in this life. Alleluia, alleluia. Why can't we just jump straight to Easter? It's tempting to skip worship on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday because we are not accustomed to going to church during the week and because the solemn and reflective nature of the worship services can be difficult. But the Good News of Easter rings hollow when we don't walk through the challenges of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Spending time in the stories and themes of Holy Week gives us time to reflect on some of the darker realities of our own lives: experiences of betrayal, times of suffering and death, periods of hopeless and despair. Having reflected and offered even these experiences to God, we are more able to hear the Good News of Easter morning—Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! God's love triumphs over *all sin, darkness, and death,* providing *hope* in the midst of even our hopelessness. I encourage you to make time during Holy Week to attend Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship that we may walk together through the Great Three Days to celebrate the fullness of Easter and all its promises.

lescent prostitution. Her own incredible story can be viewed online at https://www.youtube.com/watch?
v=5QW nsAjweE. This video shows how a young girl from a Christian home in the suburbs was drawn into the world of human trafficking.

Through its own workers and community volunteers, Theresa's organization distributes free, labelled bars of soap to hotels and motels and requests that the soap be placed in each bathroom. Often, a hotel bathroom is the only place where an adolescent victim is alone. The labels, which are attached to each wrapped bar of soap, give the National Human Trafficking Hotline's toll-free hotline number to call for help.

We have purchased 1,000 bars of soap from S.O.A.P., together with labels to be attached to the soap bars. After Easter, the labelled soap will be distributed to local hotels and motels. The soap will be labelled in the social hall during the "Passport to Holy Week" at 9:30 AM on Palm Sunday, April 9th. If any adults would like to help us with this project while their children are taking part in the Palm Sunday activities, please join us. Adults without small children are welcome to help too.

Council Highlights from March 9, 2017 meeting:

- Pastor discussed the practice of communion moving forward: "Christ's communion table is open to all. It has been the practice at Zion's for children and their parents to have a conversation with the Pastor before receiving communion for the first time. I am always happy to have these conversations, and will be offering a class during Sunday School on May 14 to go over the basics of Holy Communion. Children who haven't previously received will be recognized on Sunday May 21—Youth-led worship Sunday. Going forward, we will continue to offer a class at least yearly, and continue to recognize new communicants annually during worship, but baptized children of any age will be invited to begin receiving at any point during the year, so long as their parents/guardians agree.
- Michelle McQuaide and Michael Johnsen volunteered to be Synod Assembly representatives for 2017
- Pastor Glenn Ludwig, President of the Gettysburg Seminary Endowment Foundation, will be with us on Sunday, May 7. He will bring greetings from Gettysburg Seminary and preach. The ELCA, and many other denominations, are at the beginning of a clergy crisis—there are not enough trained pastors to fill all the viable vacant congregations. It is the job of pastors and congregations to identify and raise up potential new pastors. Pastor Ludwig's presence and message is one way we can keep this and call at the forefront.




