## Zion's Mission Statement: Reflecting Christ, we share God's gifts

#### Pastor's Pen

"I will, and I ask God to help and guide me"

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

On Sunday, June 4, you will hear four of Zion's young men and women speak these words during worship; for this phrase is the traditional response to the Affirmation Address statement to which each confirmand is asked to respond as part of the Rite of Confirmation. Some call this worship rite "Affirmation of Baptism" (that's what our hymnal says). Others use the colloquial name "Confirmation". Still others call this rite "a ritual of adult membership", which speaks to its practical implications as "confirmed" status in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America which allows one to serve on Congregational Council and vote on significant issues presented at congregational meetings. The simplest name for this rite may be "renewal".

Whatever the title, in the rite we celebrate together on June 4 these four young men and women, who have engaged in intentional faith-formative Lutheran studies for the past two years, will have the opportunity to say "Yes" to the baptismal promises that their parents made on their behalf on the day of their baptism, many years ago. While "renewal" isn't a full-fledged liturgical term for this celebration, I like how it points to the ongoing nature of what will happen for these young men and women in our congregation.

For the Rite of Confirmation, or Affirmation of Baptism, is never a once and done event. Day in and day out, through all of life's joys and difficulties, our faith is strengthened, tested, and renewed (not always in that order). Many of us can point to at least a few, specific moments in our lives when our faith was replenished and refreshed. Sometimes it is another ritual in the church's life ... perhaps a marriage, funeral, baptism, or ordination we observe. Sometimes it is a human event which "renews our faith in humanity." Sometimes it is a personal moment of crisis or opportunity in which prayer, reflection or conversation leads us to look at the world with more hopeful eyes. A few such moments for me include: my ordination, the sickness and death of my friend's daughter, sending Seth off for deployment, and, most recently, witnessing our young people lead us in worship. The truth is, our God is in the business of offering us regular moments of renewal, but we don't always have the eyes to *recognize* those moments.

As we prepare to celebrate with Elly, Max, Katie, and Joe, I invite you to consider where and how God might be offering *you* a chance to renew and refresh your faith. Maybe that opportunity will involve a person with whom you are estranged, who was a faith partner with you at a former time in your life. Maybe that opportunity will involve an activity that used to offer you the satisfaction of sharing a God-given talent or passion in a small corner of the world. Maybe that opportunity will be a re-engagement with the Spirit of God in your life, through renewed prayer, or reading, or worship. Whatever the "renewal" is that God offers to you, why not take that "leap of faith" back into a closer walk with God.

If you are with us on June 4<sup>th</sup>, maybe watching a few young adults have the courage to publicly proclaim their commitment to the God who fashioned and formed them will be enough motivation in itself. I'll look forward to sharing that moment with you when I next ... See you in church, Pastor Caitlin


King's Kids

#### APPLE TREE AND MARKERS COMMEMORATES LUTHER ANNIVERSARY

Through the "40 Action Teams in 40 Days" program, a young apple tree was planted in April by Seth Kurtz with the help of King's Kids, in the grassy area at the side of the church, facing E. Market Street. The tree is part of the 500th Reformation Anniversary commemoration. A Vermont granite marker has been placed at the foot of the tree, and it displays Martin Luther's words, "If I knew the world would perish tomorrow, I would still plant my apple tree today." The granite marker was made and generously donated by Mr. William Schaeffer of Jonestown. He is a Navy veteran who made and supplied grave markers in the local community for many years, and he is a retired member of the Jonestown Male Chorus. Mr. Schaeffer also made and donated the marker for our Wittenberg October Glory maple tree that stands by the side entrance door to the church. A thank-you card has been sent to Mr. Schaeffer on behalf of the congregation in appreciation of his gift to Zion's.

Day 1: Monday -- Departure from USA Charlotte, NC or Harrisburg, PA or Philadelphia PA

**Day 2: Tuesday** -- **Arrival** Hotel Transfer Arrival at Tel Aviv Airport meet your guide at the Airport, drive to your Hotel in Galilee for dinner and Overnight Tiberius.

**Day 3: Wednesday -- Nazareth/ Cana/Mount Tabor** Start our visit to the church of Annunciation and Cana of Galilee. Then drive towards the Sea of Galilee, visit Mount of Beatitudes, church of Multiplications of Fish & Loaves, Capernaum, Dinner and Overnight in Tiberius.


