#### Pastor's Pen

The other day, I saw a car in the grocery store parking lot with a bumper sticker that declared "Grace Happens". My first thought was to say Amen to that! (Especially in comparison to some of the other bumper stickers in that same parking lot...) But upon further reflection, the statement seems inadequate for Christian disciples. For grace does not just randomly *happen*; grace happens for a *purpose. God is grace*, and God works *intentionally* and *persistently* in our lives all the time so that we might *know* God's love, and *share* God's love. *Because God is grace* and God is constantly at work in our lives and in our world, *we are a people* of promise, possibility, and potentiality all day, every day!

As disciples of Christ, it is vitally important that we *identify* God's grace in our lives, and then *live our lives* in response to this magnificent gift. I say it's "vitally important" not because we need to somehow *earn* or *deserve* this gift (we can't and we don't) but because this is the work to which we are called in baptism, and this is the response God asks of us. While God's grace is freely given—no if's, and's, or but's—a gift this amazing isn't meant to be hoarded; God's grace is meant to be shared, and we share it by living the entirety of our lives in response to its power.

In his book, <u>The Cost of Discipleship</u>, Lutheran pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer describes the difference between merely receiving grace and not being changed by it (what he calls 'cheap grace') and living one's life in proper response to this gift (what he calls 'costly' grace) this way:

"...Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession.... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate...Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again and again, the gift which must be asked for, the door at which a man must knock. Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow, and it is grace because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it cost God the life of his Son: "ye were bought at a price," and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is grace because God did not reckon his Son too dear a price to pay for our life, but delivered him up for us. Costly grace is the Incarnation of God."

Beginning on September 24, Zion's will embark on a five-week sermon series "In response to God's Grace" Throughout these weeks, we will consider what it means to live our entire lives mindful of, and seeking to honor and share, God's gift of grace. Specifically, we will focus on how, "In response to God's grace, disciples live intentionally, share generously, trust completely, and give joyfully". I look forward to sharing this time of learning, growth, and prayer with you.

#### Teddy Bear Ministry




