


dinner in the Youth Room and then watch a movie. Stay posted for more details coming in the bulletin!

Have you ever noticed that list of names in your bulletin titled "Serving at Zion's Today" and wondered how you could become one of them? Any time is a good time to consider how you can become involved in worship at Zion's for the coming year. We have opportunities for all ages. All participation is on a rotating basis, so the frequency of service depends upon the number of people doing each job. The following are brief descriptions of the various ways to serve during service.

<u>Lector</u>

This is another name for someone who reads the lessons from the "lectionary." For us, this involves reading one, usually fairly short bible story and being the leader in the responsive reading of a Psalm (you read a verse, the congregation reads a verse). Anyone who can read out load is welcome to be a lector. Once you express interest, the coordinator will contact you and schedule a Sunday for you. A few weeks before your day to read, you will be given a copy of the lessons so you can read them ahead of time. Another copy will be on the lectern (the podium from which you read) on that Sunday morning. We have several lectors, so each one reads only a few times a year. If you find this interesting and would like to volunteer, contact Ken Hess (717) 865-2884 or Noël Strattan (717)-865-7747.


Prayers of the People

This is someone who reads the prayers during worship. This involves being the leader in the responsive reading of a printer prayer (you read a prayer, the congregation says a response). Anyone who can read out load is welcome to lead prayers of the people. Once you express interest, the coordinator will contact you and schedule a Sunday for you. You'll receive the prayer via email before your Sunday to read, so you can read them ahead of time. Another copy will be on the lectern (the podium from which you read) on that Sunday morning. Council Highlights from September 21, 2017 meeting

- Zion's will begin a five week Stewardship Preaching Series on Sunday, September 24. The theme is: "In response to God's grace", with each following week focusing on a different thing disciples do in response to God's grace. Worshipers will be asked to complete and turn in a response card on Sunday, October 29, which reflects how they intend to *respond* to God's grace in the year to come.
- Council began a review of our new Constitution, which will go to the congregation for a vote at our December congregational meeting. This new Constitution reflects many long-overdue changes that are required by the ELCA and our Lower Susquehanna Synod.
- County wide Reformation worship celebration will be held at Friedens Lutheran Church in Myerstown 10/29 at 4pm

Council Highlights from October 12, 2017 meeting

- We completed review of the new Constitution. Copies of the proposed Constitution will be available for review after the November Council meeting online, and in the Gathering Area. Questions about the new Constitution can be directed to Ed Ludwig, Noel Strattan, or Pastor Caitlin.
- Council received Pastor Caitlin's request to switch her family's healthcare from ELCA sponsored Portico • Benefits to Seth's Tricare benefits. We approved this request, which will provide better coverage for Pastor and her family, and cost Zion's less money. The annual cost differential will go into our Touching Tomorrow Endowment.



It's that time of year...time to submit requests for money from our Touching Tomorrow Endowment Fund!

What is the purpose of the "Touching Tomorrow" Endowment fund?

The Endowment Fund distributes money, in the form of grants, for mission and outreach beyond the normal church budget and usually, beyond the church walls. The aim of such grants is to "Touch Tomorrow," allowing for present and future ministry.

Who oversees the Touching Tomorrow Fund?

A Touching Tomorrow Committee oversees the Fund. This committee meets annually to decide expenditures based on the financial performance of the account and the specific requests. These purchases are not approved by council, but council approves the members of the committee. The committee currently consists of Darryl Bush (Chair), Terry Ludwig, Jim Gill, Kris Hoffer and Ashley Schade.

Where does the money come from in the Touching Tomorrow Fund?

The original money came from a large bequest to the church. Currently the fund has roughly \$420,000 in principle investments, which includes the original gift, but also later gifts and interest added to principle. Each year grants come from the interest and dividends on the account. These have varied over time. The hope is that in the future, more people will consider giving money, either in honor of loved ones, or as part of their estate planning, to the Touching Tomorrow Fund.

How can I contribute to the Touching Tomorrow Fund?

Gifts of any size are greatly appreciated, and you may benefit from significant tax advantages. By using a combination of certain financial and insurance products, you can even leave a bigger inheritance to your loved ones while preserving your desired gift to the fund. For more information on this strategy, you may consult your estate attorney or talk with Jim Gill, Zion's representative from Thrivent Financial.

What kind of things has the Touching Tomorrow Fund supported?

Between 2006 and 2017, the Fund distributed over \$100,000 to various projects, including:

- Seed money for Social Hall Renovations Project; also money for repayment of existing debt
- Payment of previous Renovation Debt
- Seed money for launching Zion's Preschool; continued scholarships for preschool families in need
- Funding to make our internship program possible
- West Virginia and New York City Youth Mission Trips
- Seminary scholarship money to support a member of our congregation, Jason Northridge, who is now a pastor
- Support for a Lutheran Missionary in West Africa, Viking Dietrich
- Support for a handful of local charities, including helping to fund a forklift for Lebanon County Christian Ministries
- Seed money for Zion's Lego Club
- Camperships to Camp Kirchenwald
- Subsidized the cost of Zion's Day Camp, making it an affordable option for families in our community

What kind of money is available for grants this year?

While the fund's investments are conservative, fluctuations in the stock market means we will not know the exact amount of the distribution until closer to December 1. Last year we were able to distribute close \$10,300; we hope this year for another generous distribution.

How can you make a request for a project?

Simple: Fill out the front of this paper by Dec 1, 2017! To do this, you will need to identify which category your request belongs to:

- Education Local Ministries
- Congregational Programs Extended Ministries (National/International church/charity work)
