Dear Church:

This year, our Lunch Bunch and Women's Bible Study groups are reading and discussing Tish Warren's *Liturgy of the Ordinary: Sacred Practices in Everyday Life*. Her basic premise is 'if we are to sense God in the big things, we must first recognize God's presence in the little things'; and so she encourages readers to consider how God is present in ordinary events like brushing our teeth, making our bed, eating, checking email, and the like. What I have appreciated about her writing is how she shifts our attention from 'big picture' ideals like striving for world peace and wanting calm, measured, and productive days, to 'little picture' actions that are firmly within our grasp—like trying to be a peace-maker with *one person* in our sphere of influence, or learning to breathe and roll through unexpected events like losing one's keys, or getting lost on the way to an appointment.

Tish reminds us that "how we spend our days is, of course, how we spend our lives" (so we can't hold grudges every day, yet expect to live a life of forgiveness because how we act every day adds up to how we act our whole lives through). She rightly remarks, "Everyone wants a revolution. No one wants to do the dishes" (p 35) and honestly reflects, "I profess big ideas about the beauty of shalom and Christ's ministry of peace crashing into our world, [yet] I often find myself squabbling and quarrelling my way through the day—with those I love the most. I'm a pacifist who yells at her husband" (p 76) Her honesty and humor speak to me, and are particularly on my mind as we embark on the holiday season.

For we often have 'high hopes' for the memories we'll make this time of year, the experiences we'll share with the ones we love, and even the spiritual transformation that will take place. These are well and good, but unless we take concrete actions in the everyday, they won't happen. Do you want to spend more time with friends and family? Then put those events on the calendar and be prepared to not do something else. Do you want to be more generous this year towards those who have less than you? Then pick up an Angel Tree or World Hunger ornament today, and decide to not buy that one or two extra sweaters for your son-in-law who never wears them anyway. Do you want to focus on the Good News of Christ's birth and promised return, instead of the commercial messages that bombard? Then pick up a devotional, and set an alarm for 7 AM, or noon, or 9 PM everyday of Advent when you will stop whatever you're doing, read scripture, and spend time in prayer—alone, or with a friend.

Our everyday patterns of behavior become our lifetime patterns of behavior. Advent, the beginning of a new liturgical year, is a wonderful time to try out 'new year's resolutions', adopting patterns of behavior that are befitting of the life we want to live. Rite of Healing—December 3



During worship on Sunday, December 3, we will celebrate the rite of healing with anointing, praying, and the laying on of hands In its ministry of healing, the church does not seek to replace the gifts of God that come through the scientific community, nor does it promise a cure. Rather, we offer and celebrate gifts such as these: God's presence with strength and comfort in time of suffering, God's promise of wholeness and peace, and God's love embodied in the community of faith. It is a privilege for us to celebrate this rite together, especially during Advent, the expectant waiting season of hope and light.

Blue Christmas Service—December 21

Jonestown Community Blue Christmas Worship Service on Thursday, December 21 at 7 PM here at Zion's. In every church and community there are persons who, for one reason or another, simply cannot enter into the unbridled joy of the Christmas season. Some must deal with the recent or expected death of a loved one. Some are coping with the aftermath of divorce, job loss, sickness—many different unfortunate and tragic circumstances. Christmas parties and caroling are the last things some of us want. "Blue Christmas" or "Longest Night" services are attempts to minister to the needs of such persons while still recognizing that part of the reason for Jesus' coming was to bring hope and comfort, to heal the sick, to seek the lost, to restore the broken and broken-hearted. Serving at Zion's Today

Have you ever noticed that list of names in your bulletin titled "Serving at Zion's Today" and wondered how you could become one of them? Any time is a good time to consider how you can become involved in worship at Zion's for the coming year. We have opportunities for all ages. All participation is on a rotating basis, so the frequency of service depends upon the number of people doing each job. The following are brief descriptions of the various ways to serve during service.

<u>Usher</u>


The usher is someone who serves in a group of four. One of the responsibilities of the position is to distribute bulletins to congregants as they enter the sanctuary. Another responsibility of an usher is to assist congregants in finding a seat for worship. Additionally, the usher is to use the communion plates to collect offering and to dismiss/invite congregants to the communion rail. One of the ushers is also responsible to ring the church bell to call the community to worship. Usher groups serve on a monthly rotation. Children's Sermon

Persons responsible for Children's Sermons would be responsible for delivering the message of the day to the children of the congregation during worship. You will be given suggested sermons to deliver to the children. You can either follow that format or chose to develop your own message (as long as it follows the theme given to you for that Sunday). Once you express interest, the coordinator will contact you and schedule a Sunday for you and provide you with the suggest sermon(s) for your Sunday. Rotation is based on the number of volunteers. Typically, you would deliver the children's sermon two-three times per calendar year. Suicide Prevention Training: Tuesday, January 9 at 6:30 PM

According to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, nearly 43,000 people complete suicide in the United States every year. That means that an American takes her or her own life approximately once every 12.3 minutes. In response to this growing problem in our nation, the Jonestown Council of Churches is sponsoring a suicide prevention training in January, led by professionals from the Lebanon County Suicide Prevention task force. This event is FREE and open to the community.

What? Participants will be trained in the QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) strategy of assisting those having suicidal ideations. Through this training, you will become a gatekeeper, able to better recognize signs, offer help, and connect persons to resources.

Who? Open to all members of our community, and perhaps particularly helpful for teachers, coaches, scout leaders, and parents. Participants will receive a course completion certificate at the end of the evening.
