Dear Church:

If you haven't yet heard, the liturgical (church) calendar gives us a bit of a chuckle this year. Ash Wednesday, a day of repentance and of remembering our mortality, is on Valentine's Day, February 14! (Nothing says "love" quite like ashes!) And Easter is on April 1st...also known as April Fool's Day. It's an odd year, to be sure, but, more importantly—Lent is coming fast and furious! The season of Lent is historically a time of intentional learning, repentance, and preparation for the great celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. On behalf of our Christian Education and Worship committees, I want to invite you and your household to several special events that will be happening at Zion's prior to, and during, Lent.



But first...What was I supposed to do with that star again? On January 7, we celebrated the Epiphany of our Lord by remembering the gift of the star given to the magi. We talked about how the magi had their eyes attune to the skies, so recognized the star when it rose, and trusted enough to follow it to the Christ child. We reflected on how God continually gives us gifts—signs of God's presence and protection in the world—but, oftentimes, in the hurried and loud world in which we live, we overlook these gifts. Everyone who was in worship that day received a star with one gift of God printed upon it. You were encouraged to tack this star up at home some where you'll see it often, and *look for* this gift in your daily life in the year to come. When you witness this gift making itself manifest, you are

encouraged to recognize that moment as a gift of God—the idea being, the more we *look* for signs of God's presence, the more we will *see* those signs, for we know God is always present and working in our lives. Throughout the year, and again next year on Epiphany, we will share what we have learned from our Star Gifts.

Sunday, February 4 at 9:30 AM: 'Come to the Table' Intergenerational Communion Class. We believe and teach that communion is God's gift to God's children, and we welcome all who are baptized to receive communion as soon as they express desire, and their parents or guardians give permission for them to do so. We annually offer this class about Holy Communion and its gifts because we believe that what one can understand at five is different than what one understands at fifteen, twenty-five, and ninety-five—and we invite all of these ages (and everyone in between!) to participate, including those who are already communing, those who hope to begin communing soon, and those who won't be communing for some time) will participate. Baptized children who (with their parent's consent) wish to begin communing may do so on any Sunday. We will recognize all who have begun communing in the past year on Sunday, March 18, which is Youth Sunday. If you and your child agree that they will begin communing on March 18, please let me know so I can be sure to recognize them that day. If you would like to talk about baptism for your child, please be in touch.

Sunday, February 18 at 9:30 AM: Intergenerational Lent Event. An all-ages interactive program about Lent, its history, its themes, and its promises.

Wednesday, February 14 Ash Wednesday: *Spoken Worship at Noon, Rejoicing Spirits Worship at 6:15 PM, and Traditional Worship at 7 PM.* Additionally, you are welcome to join us for dinner at 5:30 PM. An extended King's Kids session will be offered during 7 PM worship, if parents desire to attend worship while their kids participate in Ash Wednesday activities.

Wednesdays during Lent (February 21, 28 and March 7, 14, and 21) Holden Evening Prayer in the Sanctuary at 7:00 PM. We will gather around the theme of "Covenant", looking at the great covenants of the Old Testament, as well as the promises made by God, and by us, at baptism.

Sunday, March 18 at 10:30 AM: Youth Sunday. Be sure to join us for worship as our youngest members share their gifts for leadership. Last year we experienced what a joy it is to "let the little children lead", and we can't wait to do it again!

Palm Sunday, March 25 at 9:30 AM: Intergenerational Passport to Holy Week. A hands-on experience highlighting the events of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. We will also work together on a mission project this morning.

Wednesday, March 28 at 6:15 PM: Rejoicing Spirits Holy Week Worship featuring foot washing and Holy Communion. *No Holden Evening Prayer*.


