Dear Friends in Christ: God's grace and peace to you! Lent began with the unusual mix of chocolate and ashes as Ash Wednesday fell on Valentine's Day for the first time since 1945. Lent ends on Easter, which, this year falls on April Fool's Day. Yes, it's an interesting year. But in-between these unusual bookends, we have the tried-and-true season of Lent, which reaches its pinnacle during Holy Week. It is my hope and prayer that we would orient our hearts, minds, *and schedule* this season towards Lent's themes of repentance and reflection, by utilizing the devotional booklets we have provided (or another of your choosing), by participating in the almsgiving disciplines of the coin collection and Baskets of Love, and by making time for Sunday and Wednesday worship, as well as personal prayer. During Holy Week, we invite you to experience the breadth and depth of Jesus' last days through these special worship services that have been observed for centuries:

Palm Sunday- Before Jesus was crucified, he rode into Jerusalem on a donkey to the praises of a huge crowd. People honored him by laying down palm branches and coats before him, fulfilling a prophecy from Zechariah that our king come to us "humble and riding on a donkey" (Zechariah 9:9) We enter Holy Week praising our King with Hosannas just as the people praised Jesus 2,000 years ago. However, we also remember on this day that it wasn't long until the people's cries changed from "hosanna" to "crucify him."

Maundy Thursday – We remember how Jesus shared the Passover meal with his disciples, taught them to celebrate the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion), and washed their feet. We call this day "Maundy" (Latin for 'commandment') Thursday because Jesus also issued a new commandment this night: teaching his disciples to "Love one another, as he loves us" (John 13:34). After dinner, Jesus is betrayed by Judas, arrested, and put on trial.

Good Friday - This is the day Jesus foretold throughout His ministry, the day Jesus suffers and dies at the hands of men. Why do we call this day 'Good'? Because in this act God demonstrates God's unending perfect love for the world, showing us *just how much* God loves us. We remember this day with solemn contemplation, but also with hope because we know this isn't the end of God's story.

Easter Sunday – Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! We celebrate Jesus' triumph over death and the devil with all the "alleluias" we can exclaim for this is the most beautiful day, and promise, of our faith. Death does not have the final the word, for Christ is risen! Through Christ, we, too, will be raised from the dead to live with God forever. And with Christ, we have hope for all the challenges we face in this life. Alleluia, alleluia.

Why can't we just jump straight to Easter? It's tempting to skip worship on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday because we are not accustomed to going to church during the week and because the solemn and reflective nature of the worship services can be difficult. But the Good News of Easter rings hollow when we don't walk through the challenges of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Spending time in the stories and themes of Holy Week gives us time to reflect on some of the darker realities of our own lives: experiences of betrayal, times of suffering and death, periods of hopelessness and despair. Having reflected and offered even these experiences to God, we are better able to hear the Good News of Easter morning—Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! God's love triumphs over *all sin, darkness, and death,* providing *hope* in the midst of even our hopelessness. I encourage you to make time during Holy Week to attend Maundy Thursday Dinner Church and Good Friday worship that we may walk together through the Great Three Days to celebrate the fullness of Easter and all its promises.

Council Highlights from February 8, 2018 meeting

- Council this year is exploring what it means to practice making disciples in a "high invitation, high challenge" fashion. One way is to volunteer to be one of the many "helpers" at each worship service that Pr. Kurtz recently has been outlining before each service. Get involved!
- Another way is to represent Zion's Lutheran in Synod meetings. There will be upcoming opportunities around April 21 and May 31. You don't have to currently serve on council to represent our congregation before the bigger church! If you think you might be interested, talk to Pr. Kurtz. Michael Johnsen and Michele McQuaide went last year and can also share their experiences.
- Stay tuned! There soon will be a new addition in the form of a 55-inch monitor to our gathering space. Council will be cycling announcements on that monitor before and after service, and we'll be looking to broadcast the service from the sanctuary.

Pastor Caitlin's Family Leave: In case you miss the congregational meeting, here are the highlights of the Family Leave Plan our Council approved for Pastor Caitlin upon the birth of Baby Kurtz.

Pastor Caitlin plans to work until the baby's birth, and then take ten weeks of leave (six weeks are paid maternity leave, two weeks are vacation, and two weeks are unpaid) to recover, and to begin to figure out life as a family of three. Baby Kurtz's due date is April 28, which means leave will run until sometime in July. Regardless of when the baby is born, she plans to be back for Day Camp and Vacation Bible School.



2018 Lent Initiatives: One of the disciplines of Lent is almsgiving—the practice of giving money and goods to those who are in need. In this spirit, we are working on two projects this Lent:



Baskets of Love: We will be putting together laundry baskets filled with basic home supplies to be given to men and women who are leaving prison, and embarking on new lives in the community. Oftentimes, when one is released from prison, he or she lacks support networks and the resources to afford basic supplies for daily living, such as soap, laundry detergent, personal hygiene products, and the like. There is a board in the Gathering Area with post-it notes listing the needed supplies. *Each post-it represents one item.* We hope to put together five baskets, which

will be distributed through our synod's Criminal Justice System Ministry team to group homes for returning citizens, community correction centers, or individual housing arrangements.

Please return these items by Palm Sunday (March 25)--the baskets will be assembled at our Passport to Holy Week All-Ages event, which you are invited to attend that day at 9:30 AM!



Coin Collection for Domestic Violence Intervention of Lebanon County: After



Jesus shared the Last Supper with his disciples, He was betrayed by Judas, who told the authorities Jesus' whereabouts for a few silver coins. In remembrance of this act of betrayal, and in recognition of all the ways we, too, betray Jesus on a regular basis, at our Dinner Church worship service on Maundy Thursday, we will be casting coins into soup pots. These coins (and dollars!) will be given to individuals who have likewise been betrayed by intimate friends and partners--the clients of Domestic Violence Intervention of Lebanon County. We have collection jars available in the Gathering Area for you to use to collect coins throughout the season of Lent. We ask that you bring all contributions to church on Palm Sunday, or to Dinner Church on Maundy Thursday. THANK YOU for helping us support some of the most vulnerable in our community.
