Poet Ann Weems reflects on Palm Sunday in her poem "The Way" (from her book *Kneeling in Jerusalem*):

The way to Jerusalem looks suspiciously like Highway 27,

and the pilgrims look suspiciously like you and me.

*I expected the road to Jerusalem to be crowded with holy people...* 

clerics and saints... people who have kindness wrinkled in their faces and comfort lingering in their voices,

but this is more like rush hour... horns blowing, people pushing, voices cursing... this is not what I envisioned!

O God, I've only begun and already, I feel I've lost my way. Surely this is not the road and surely these are not the ones to travel with me.

This Lenten journey calls for holy retreat, for reflection, and repentance. Instead of holiness, this highway is crammed with the cacophony of chaos.

Is there no back road to Jerusalem? No quiet path where angels tend to weary travelers?

No sanctuary from the noise of the world? Just this?

Can this hectic highway be the highway to heaven?

That last line speaks to me every year at this time: "Can this hectic highway be the highway to heaven?" Sometimes we have such high expectations for Lent, Holy Week, and Easter (akin to the high expectations we sometimes have for Advent and Christmas) maybe *this year* will be different, we think. Maybe *this year* I'll be consistent in devotions, prayer, and spiritual practices; and, maybe if I am, I'll experience a higher spiritual high related to Jesus' death and resurrection than I have before. Maybe, just maybe... And then life barges in with what Ann Weems describes as its "cacophony of chaos". On top of the usual tasks that call for our attention, the fact that Lent arrived so early this year (and, therefore, so does Easter!), and the fact that we had to postpone our Lent Event and then cancel 40% of our Lenten Wednesday worship services due to snow makes the Lenten season of preparation and repentance seem a bit rushed. At least to me. But like the crocuses that popped up just a few days before the latest snow storm (which is coming down as I write this), the beauty of Easter is that Easter comes whether we're ready for it or not. Whether we've had what we consider to be "a holy Lent", or not. Whether we've found moments for 'holy retreat, reflection, and repentance', or not. Whether we've spent time on quiet paths where angels tend to weary travelers, or not.

Because it was into, and for, our 'hectic highway' of a world that Jesus came, lived, died, and was resurrected. It was for pilgrims who look 'suspiciously like you and me' that God descended from God's heavenly throne to be born in flesh and blood, in a barn, because there was no room for Him in the inn. And it is in the midst of ordinary life, in the most unlikely and unexpected places, that Jesus still makes God's gifts of *new life* known. While there are some places we are accustomed to looking for, and seeing, God—in worship, or Bible study, or Holy Communion, for example—the season of Easter invites us to open our eyes and hearts to see God in the unlikely, loud, chaotic, places. For Christ has been raised (Alleluia!) just as He said, and He is alive and active in our midst: in places like the grocery store checkout aisle, in conversations with our boss, in friendships, in challenging conversations, and even in sickness and death; our God is a God of new things and new life, in all times and places. As we enter into Holy Week and the great celebration of Easter, may we trust in God's promise of everlasting presence and hope, and pay attention to the new life in our midst.


