Dear Zion's Members and Friends:

God's grace and peace to you this day! At our January congregational meeting, we played "Family Feud". The answers to the game were generated by your answers to a survey, asking about everything from your favorite hymn to your favorite congregational dinner dessert. We had a lot of fun, and learned a few things along the way.

One of the things I learned is that "Lent" is Zion's least favorite season of the church year. In second place? Holy Week. I suppose *some* church season has to fill that spot, but I'll admit I was a little surprised to see "Holy Week" as our second least favorite 'season'. Holy Week is the week that runs between Palm Sunday (this year, April 14) and Easter Sunday (April 21); the week that includes Mary anointing Jesus' feet, Jesus washing the disciples' feet and instituting the Lord's Supper, Judas betraying and Peter denying Jesus, Jesus' trials before Pilate and Herod, and Jesus' crucifixion and death. It was a busy week for Jesus and His friends and continues to be a full week in the life of the church as we remember and reflect upon these events. It can also be a difficult week, a sad week. A week that urges us to acknowledge the sin of our own lives and the brokenness of our world, but it is, at the same time, a wonderfully rich week of hope, and unending love. Particularly, God's unending love for each of us.

For this week to rank as our second "least favorite season" in the church tells me that, somewhere along the line, we've missed the point and missed out on the Good News that this week holds for our lives and for our world. The stories of Holy Week can be difficult because we know that they are real: betrayal, denial, suffering, death, manipulation, and injustice are still very much a part of our world. We might think that by ignoring or overlooking them, they will go away. But they won't. Until God's Kingdom comes on earth as it is in heaven, each of these will be a part of our lives. The events of Holy Week invite us to name this reality so that God's light of Truth and resurrection hope can shine in the darkness. A book we'll use during our All Church Event (on Palm Sunday, April 14), describes the events of Holy Week as Easter Love Letters from God, which I think is a beautiful way of describing the depth and purpose and meaning of this sacred week. For when we go straight

from Jesus' triumphal entry on Palm Sunday to our shouts of "Alleluia, Jesus Christ is Risen Today!" on Easter, we miss hearing the Good News that God is present and active every time we encounter betrayal and denial, when we experience suffering and death, and when we encounter injustice or simple hatred. This is what Martin Luther called "theology of the cross" vs "theology of glory": our God is not simply Lord when good things happen, our God is Lord in all times and in all places. Jesus' death on the cross, and all the events that led to that moment, testifies that God is with us even when we feel abandoned (as Jesus did), when all our friends walk out (as Jesus' friends did), and when we die (as Jesus did). That is the Good News of the Gospel, the Good News of Holy Week, that we need to hear time and time again.

So I urge you to make Holy Week worship a priority this year:

We'll gather on Maundy ("Commandment") Thursday, April 18, for worship with confession, the opportunity to see all our sins literally vanish before our eyes as words of forgiveness are spoken, handwashing, Holy Communion, and the stripping of the altar in remembrance of Judas' betrayal and Jesus' loss of life.

On Good Friday, April 19, we'll experience Jesus' Seven Last Words thru the Eyes of Zion's. Members of our community have prepared reflections, with words and with art, on the seven phrases Jesus' uttered on the cross. It promises to be a personal and moving evening for our congregation as we consider what Jesus' words mean for our lives and our world.

These two worship experiences, together with our Rejoicing Spirits Holy Week celebration on Wednesday, April 17, will prepare our hearts and minds to shout with confidence "Christ is Ris'n! He is Ris'n Indeed!" on Easter morning. Hope to see you in worship.



Zion's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Jonestown 2019 Application for Church Camp Scholarship

Zion's is committed to making sure everyone in our congregation is able to experience Lutheran church camp, regardless of the family's ability to pay. We believe that summer camp is a wonderful opportunity for people of all ages to live in Christian community, to experience God's presence in the great outdoors, and to be renewed in their faith. We believe that participation in outdoor camps helps to strengthen disciples for service and proclamation of the Gospel, and we are excited to offer camping opportunities through our partnership with the Lutheran Camping Corporation. Our congregation's generous giving to our General Fund makes possible camping scholarships for all who are interested.

Please be aware of key scholarship details for 2019:

- Scholarship forms must be completed and returned to the Church Office by May 1, 2019, together with a *copy* of your camp registration form. Incomplete or late applications may not be considered.
- Zion's will provide a scholarship for *one* camping experience per child per summer. This helps ensure that everyone has an opportunity to go at least one time.
- The baseline scholarship award will be:
 - o \$220 for a week of camp
 - o \$110 for a week of mini camp
 - o \$80 for a week of Day Camp at Nawakwa or Kirchenwald
- Greater awards will be considered when families demonstrate financial need. Please speak with Pastor Caitlin if you need more financial assistance.
- Zion's camp scholarships are different from Camperships available through the Lutheran Camping Corporation. You are eligible to apply for LCC Camperships in addition to the money awarded by Zion's.

These are the steps for registering for camp:

- Complete the camp registration form, as found online (https://www.lutherancamping.org/) or in the camp brochure.
 - o In the 'discounts' section, be sure to mark "\$20 Camp Person attended meeting". This will save you \$20. If you need help calculating the other discounts, please speak with Pastor Caitlin. Note that another discount is available if you register and pay in full by April 6!
 - o In the "my church is paying" section, write either \$220, \$110, or \$80, as described above.
- *Make a copy of your registration form for Zion's.*
- Mail your registration form, and deposit, directly to the Lutheran Camping Corporation.
