God's grace and peace be with you! For many years (over 20, we believe), Zion's has been well-served with the mission statement: Reflecting Christ, we share God's gifts. But both the Jonestown community and our congregation have changed greatly in 20 years, and our Council felt that now was a good time to re-evaluate who we are, and where and how God is calling us to serve. So, with guidance from Deacon Marsha Roscoe, lots of Bible study, prayer, and many, many sticky notes, we have discerned a new mission statement and Guiding Principles that will help us live into, and live out, God's purpose for our congregation. We are excited to share these with you.

#### Mission: Gathered by God's grace, we are empowered to serve and sent to share Christ's love.

Gathered by God's grace: We recognize that we are a congregation because of God, and God's grace at work in our lives. God's grace is given to us as a gift and everything we do in our lives, and in our congregation, is in response to this grace. God's grace calls us together, a seemingly 'random' assortment of people, blesses us, and gives us work to do.

*Empowered to serve:* What we do when we are gathered together—worship, Christian education, fellowship, mutual encouragement—fills us with spiritual, emotional, and physical strength to serve others in our congregation, community, and world. We believe we are richly blessed by God (time, talent, and treasure) in order to share/serve/care for those who are in need in any way

**Sent to share Christ's love:** We know that our congregation doesn't exist to serve ourselves; we are SENT out into the world, following the Great Commission, to share Christ's love in word and in deed. We recognize that any good we can do/any love we can share comes not from us, but from Christ. Because "Christ" means "anointed one"—by using this name for Jesus, we are also proclaiming our belief in Jesus as Savior.

#### **Zion's Guiding Principles:**

We relate to our community. We know that we are not a church in isolation. We are in relationship with many communities—geographically in Jonestown, but also part of the Lower Susquehanna Synod and the ELCA, as well as the larger global community. We believe all these communities are important, and that we are particularly in Jonestown for a reason. We want to know our neighbors, and we want our neighbors to know us.

We are grounded in faith practices. We recognize that anything and everything we do we do in response to God's gracious love. We look for direction and strength for the work we do in scripture, prayer, and worship, which means we regularly participate in these disciplines, together as a community, and in our homes.

We invite people to join in God's work for the sake of the world, in whatever way they can. We believe God is on a mission to renew and restore our world. There is always work to be done and everyone has a role to play in that work. We invite others to join in worship, education, and service opportunities, and we celebrate the gifts and abilities God has given to each person.

Our Council is excited to share this mission statement and these guiding principles with you, and eager to live them. Our next step will be to establish ministry goals for the near future. #### Council Highlights from May 9, 2019 meeting

• Maddie Hess and Reilly Harmon shared their confirmation projects with Council. The remaining Confirmation students will share their projects in June.

- Be aware of the new handicapped accessible door which should be installed by June. Once the automatic opener is installed, PLEASE use it, even if you don't "need" it. Manually opening a door with an automatic opener on it damages the door; please get in the habit of pressing the button! Thank you to all who gave financially to this project. Following installation, painting and carpet installation will begin in the areas that had been damaged by the pipe leak.
- Several council members met with Property Committee and plan to meet quarterly in an effort to reorganize the property needs and expenses. This will assist in budgeting appropriately for property maintenance.
- Following inspection, it was noted that there are 17 fire alarm sensors in need of replacing at a cost of \$100 a sensor. This will be completed prior to the start of the new preschool year.
- Arranged for Council presence if Zion's Social Hall and main floor are being used as a rain site for "Summerfest" on Saturday June 1.
- Decided to include financial updates in the newsletter quarterly. This would keep congregants updated in terms of income, expenses, and how their donations are being allocated.

#### Fresh Start Emergency Shelter

Salem Lutheran Church will be hosting the Fresh Start (Providing Emergency Shelter) program from the evening of July 15th till July 29th, 2019 At 119 North 8th Street, Lebanon PA 17046. Each evening (8:15 pm to 9:45 pm) we will need four volunteers for check-in. Both genders should be represented, so that a man is doing the security check for the male guests, and a woman for the female guests. We will also have a volunteer taking attendance and a couple of volunteers serving snacks.

For the overnight shift (9:00 pm to 7:30 am) we will need two volunteers, again one of each gender. (Please bring your own pillow and sleeping bag or blanket.) The homeless shelter is a joint volunteer effort of the Lebanon Lutheran Co-op churches, Zion Lutheran Church in Lebanon city, Holy Trinity Church in the city of Lebanon, Zion Lutheran Church in Jonestown and the Oaisis para el Cansado located at Salem Lutheran Church.

You should sign up for only one job per shift, but you are welcome to sign up for both the evening and overnight shifts. (For example, you cannot be both a check-in clerk and a food prep volunteer on the same night, but you can be both a check-in clerk and an overnight volunteer on the same night.)

If the LCCM emergency shelter coordinator is not present (as she is for most check-in times), she is only a phone call away and will deal with any problems you don't feel comfortable handling. The guests are familiar with the rules and procedures of the Fresh Start program, and are generally extremely cooperative and grateful.

There is a need for volunteers to help with the shelter. A volunteer training session will be held on Monday, June 10, 2019, in Salem Lutheran's Parish building (the red brick building) at 6 p.m. Wenda Dinatele, Client Service Manager from Lebanon County Christian Ministries, will be conducting the training. Everyone is invited to attend, to ask questions and to tour the location where the shelter will be taking place.

#### Theme Basket Auction (formerly Basket Bash) update:

Even though it may seem far off, our basket auction will be here before we know it. This year, we are asking the congregation for support in different ways. One of the ways we are looking for your support is to supply specific items we need to complete baskets that are started. There is a display board in the gathering area where you are welcome to take a post-it note to purchase an item(s) that are needed. #### What's going on with the building? And a financial update.

By now, you've noticed the plywood in the entry way. We had a heating pipe leak that caused damage to the walls and floor. The leak is fixed, the floor patched, and soon, the carpet will be replaced, and the walls repainted. The good news is that most of that will be covered by insurance, and the plumber generously donated his services.

The not-so-good news: that leak is perhaps the most visible of the building issues we've faced these past few months, but it is not the only issue. And the others aren't covered by insurance. After inspection, we learned that 17 of our fire alarm sensors need to be replaced (they have simply reached the end of their lifespan, in fact, they have outlived what would be typically expected) to a tune of about \$2100. The other 30 or so sensors throughout the building will need to be replaced soon, too. We also discovered on Easter Sunday that the sanctuary A/C was not working as it should. A maintenance call revealed that one unit needed freon (\$350), one had a broken motor mount (\$260) and the third had extensive motor issues (\$1,000). The first two issues have been fixed, and parts have been ordered for the third.

All that's to say: It's been an expensive couple of months at Zion's due to building issues we really can't ignore. Our Council wants you to be aware of these expenses, and of the bigger picture: our building is aging, and more and more repairs are to be expected.

We are grateful that our Property Team has recently re-organized and is developing a proactive plan to address as many issues as possible before they become problems. We are thankful for their knowledge, dedication, and sharing of time. And also looking for more people to help! If you're able to lend a hand, please let Pastor Caitlin or Christine Techky (933-5298) know.

At Zion's, we believe that all that we have is a gift from God, who has entrusted money, time, skills, and relationships into our care. God calls us to share what God has entrusted into our care for the building up of God's Kingdom on earth. We do that, in part, by giving to Zion's. Your financial gifts support the ministry that is done in this place and help to care for the building that houses many of those ministries. We are grateful for your financial support. For those for whom numbers are helpful, we'd like to share where we are, financially, at the end of April. You'll see that we are still well within budgeted expenses because our committees do a wonderful job of monitoring expenses, and because many of the bills for the repairs mentioned above have not yet been received.

For 2019, through a special "Thrivent Communities" project, Jim Gill of Thrivent Financial has secured \$3,500 of funding! This will substantially increase the generosity that we can achieve for our local children in need. In addition to the donations of new and gently used clothing, our 2019 goals are:

- Extend the invitation to all families that utilize the JOY food pantry
- Include all children within needy families, not just elementary ages
- Provide backpacks for each child
- Provide basic school supplies, including notebooks, pens, pencils
- Provide elementary students with a school box for home use (glue sticks, scissors, erasers, crayons, tape, etc.)
- Invite all Jonestown churches to join us and help pack the items
