Dear Members and Friends of Zion's:

God's grace and peace be with you today! I just got back from a morning at the Central PA Food Bank in Harrisburg, where I sorted huge pallets of zucchini, yellow squash, and green peppers into six-pound bags with many of our youth. This trip to the food bank has become a sort of summer-time tradition with our Youth Group: giving them an opportunity to serve, learn more about the hunger problem in our nation, and spend time with one another. We usually have fun there, but I was a little concerned that, the week before summer ends, they'd rather spend the morning sleeping in or by the pool. After our shift, I asked: "What did it feel like to spend one of your last summer mornings working in a warehouse?" "No big deal", they responded. "The work had to be done." "Now people will be able to eat." "Service is what we do". And, in that moment, my heart was again filled with joy. Our kids 'get' that service is a critical piece of discipleship, and they understand that sacrifice is part of the Christian walk, too. Sure, in this case, we're talking about a few hours on a Wednesday morning; but a few hours here, and a few hours there, intentionally and purposefully carried out, are the building blocks for a life lived for our neighbor, not ourselves.

I'm grateful to be part of a faith community that understands that all that we have, our very life included, is a gift from God, intended to be shared with the world. From the youngest child to the most senior adult, we strive to teach and live this core value, and to provide opportunities to practice it. This past Sunday's Back to School Blessings event was one such opportunity; September's God's Work, Our Hands service afternoon is another. Last Sunday we served 48 students with new shoes, new socks and underwear, new jeans, new back to school outfits, new backpacks stuffed with supplies, haircuts, and lots of gently used clothing. We couldn't have done this without your financial support, help gathering and sorting clothes, and help on the day of the event. On September 15, we invite you to stay after worship for a few hours of service—either making Christmas

decorations for deployed troops, traveling to Spang Crest to sing hymns with the residents there, packing Homeless Blessing bags, helping at the rental property or completing a project in the Jonestown Borough. Again, it will only be a few hours of light work, but opportunities like these help us practice our 'serving' muscles and remind us that life is not about what we can do for ourselves, but what we can do for others.

We'll continue to explore how serving others is critical to who we are in our Fall Sermon Series that begins on September 8: "Gathered, Empowered, Sent". Lessons from the book of Acts, describing life in the early Christian church, will guide our time together as we reflect on our newly discerned purpose and guiding principles. Be sure to join us for a pancake breakfast at 9 AM that morning, followed by our first All Church event of the year at 9:30 AM. Following last year's "Year of the Bible", the 2019-2020 school year will be the "Year of the Catechism"—Don't know what that is? Then you'll want to check out these monthly events! This theme was also inspired by one of our guiding principles: We are grounded in faith practices.

Finally, I am pleased to share with you (at the top of this page) our newly designed logo that reflects who Zion's is today, and where God is calling us to go. The logo was designed by Kim Imler, friend of Jacob Beidler. The roots represent how we are "rooted" in faith and in our Jonestown community; deep roots give strength to the tree and help us bear good fruit in the world. The sun's rays reflect our praise of Christ, and our call to shine Christ's light in the world. The birds represent the Holy Spirit who sends us *out* to share the Good News and to serve our neighbors. Thank you, Kim, for sharing your gifts with us!

I look forward to seeing you soon in worship. May you know God's blessing today and everyday.



- Council expresses their gratitude for the contributions towards the handicapped accessible door, which was fully funded. Previously, we had been told that manually opening the door would damage the opener; this was incorrect information.
- Council approved the recommendation from the Cemetery Committee that the two feet on our side of Esther Avenue that the Borough requested *not* be surrendered to the Borough.
- Council voted on a new logo that conveys our Purpose and Guiding Principles. We thank everyone for their contributions and look forward to unveiling the logo and its designer in September.
- Council continued conversation about how to further share our Purpose and Guiding Principles with the congregation--there will be a five week sermon series in September and October, followed by small group studies in January and February



HOMELESS BLESSING BAGS

Have you ever passed a homeless person and felt compassion for them but did not know how to respond? Some folks on our Mission Ministry Team had this happen to them so we decided to respond as Jesus taught us in the story of the Good Samaritan. We found an idea

to help folks do this. A Homeless Blessing Bag is an item folks can keep in their cars or backpacks to give to a homeless person you see while visiting or traveling through a neighborhood. Some of the items that would be put into a Ziploc bag would be: Breakfast or granola bars, trail mix, applesauce cups, gift cards to a fast food place, hand wipes,

water bottle. We will be gathering items in August and September to assemble at Zion's God's Work Our Hands Sunday, September 15. A display will be up in the gathering area with details and you will be able to participate. The bags will be available to anyone who thinks they may want to be prepared to help the homeless. We will also have information available for folks who may want to make their own blessing bags.
