#### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

God's grace and peace to you this autumn day! In a sermon a few weeks ago, I shared stories of the real and meaningful ways God is at work in and through our congregation. The Gospel for that day was the story of Jesus healing the ten lepers, and one returning to give thanks. Together, we reflected on what it looks like for God to heal and restore in 'ordinary', everyday ways—like simply telling the ten men to 'go to the priest' and making them well 'along the way'. Each and every day, God's love and care is funneling in and *out* of our congregation. As the pastor, I get to see this happen all the time, and I think it's important that you know the amazing work that's taking place, too! Here's a snapshot of what God's been up to lately (disclaimer: this is *not* an exhaustive list!):

- --Our August Back to School Blessings event served 65 students in our community *not only* with material needs, but also with encouragement, joy, snacks, hugs, and a morale boost that they, too, could start the school year with confidence.
- --Our Wednesday night meal and worship continues to welcome new families. Since the arrival of Madelyn, Seth and my dinner table is always *filled* with children. The other night I asked: "What's the best part of your day so far?" The first two who answered, both of whom have special needs, said, "Well, *of course*, church is the best part of my day", and "Coming, here, *obviously*."
- --One of our Wednesday families drives 45 minutes, one way, for this 30 minute worship service. They've experienced health problems recently, and as we've prayed together, they've expressed again and again how grateful they are for this spiritual community where both mom and son can grow.
- --Another woman connected with our congregation right before an important diagnosis. While she hasn't been able to worship here regularly, she worships with us online, receives home communion visits, and is so grateful for Zion's prayer shawl. She looks forward to returning as soon as she is able.

- --Another new Wednesday family is here because one of our families has been *persistent* in inviting and encouraging. They are grateful to have found a place they are welcomed as they are, and able to teach their children how to worship.
- --Someone who has been coming to Bible study for two years now, after never before being in one. The other week he exclaimed "This Bible stuff is actually starting to make some sense!"
- --A young couple visited and told me "I pretty much gave up on the church because of the divisiveness I witnessed in my congregation growing up, but worshiping here made me realize *all* churches aren't like that".

Look, I know we're not perfect, but God is doing amazing work in and through us. Sometimes people ask, "How can we tell these stories without seeming like we're bragging—saying how great we are?" My response was, and is, "We give God the praise". God is working in and through Zion's in powerful ways—ways that are worthy of praise, and thanks, and sharing!! I believe it is so, so important to name and share these stories, so we can see and believe for ourselves that God is still at work redeeming, restoring, and renewing our world.

God's work is accomplished through our hands, feet, and voices, and God's work is supported by our financial contributions. Zion's is grateful for the money you give in support of these, and many other, ministries. Our expenses are currently \$10,000 above our income for the year, due to building issues that needed to be immediately addressed (fire alarm sensors that had gone bad, water damage in the Gathering Area, and sanctuary A/C repairs). As Thanksgiving summons us to 'give thanks' for all that God has first given us, please consider an extra gift to Zion's to support the ongoing ministries of this congregation. God is at work in powerful ways, and we are each partners of that work. Thank you for all the ways you share your time, talent, and treasure with our congregation. It is incredible to watch the work God is doing in and through this place.



### Council Highlights from October 10, 2019 meeting

- Celebrated the \$3500 profit raised by the Theme Basket Raffle-Auction, all of which will support the 2020 Back
  to School Blessings event. Also celebrated that more people attended this year, especially community members.
  THANK YOU to our congregation for your participate in the event, and help collecting items throughout the
  summer.
- Noted that the Council terms for Deb Reiner, Matt Wolfe, Tracy Hoy, and Larry Houser end this year. Larry is not eligible for re-election, but the others are. Named Larry as the Nominating Committee Chair for the coming year. Elections will be held after worship on Sunday December 8.
- Upon Pastor's request, agreed to change Council meeting date for 2020 from the second Thursday to the third Monday of the month.
- Set a rental policy for chairs/tables to be borrowed by members from the Social Hall at a fee of \$5/table and \$1/chair. All fees collected will go towards the Social Hall loan. Rentals will be approved by the office, and need to be returned by the agreed upon date.
- Discussed the \$10,000 year to date deficit we are running. While giving is above where it was last year, expenses related to the building have been higher. Terry Ludwig, finance chair, will share this information in worship, and ask families to increase giving through the end of the year.
- Pastor Caitlin will lead a conversation on how to discuss "Tough Topics" on Wednesday evenings.
- Studied Bible texts related to current topics, using some of the skills that will be taught in the "Talking Together about Tough Topics" class, which begins on Wednesday October 30 at 6:50 PM and continues for 4 weeks.

**Talking Together about Tough Topics:** Many of us were taught to avoid talking about politics and religion--especially in mixed company. Right now, our nation is bearing the fruits of that lesson: we have lost all ability to talk (and listen) civilly with one another about important topics like immigration, race, the environment, money, and international affairs. As another important election year approaches, I fear this divide is only going to grow deeper. *Our faith invites us to another way: to listen, and talk, with respect for each other, a desire to understand, and, ultimately, a desire to follow God's will in our* 

*lives*. To this end, I will be leading a four week study on WHY we need to have tough conversations and HOW to do so, followed by two weeks of practicing these skills on a topic of group's choice. I hope you'll join the conversation on Wednesday nights from 6:50 - 7:30 PM, beginning Wednesday October 30. Peace, Pastor Caitlin.





#### HOMELESS BLESSING BAGS

Have you ever passed a homeless person and felt compassion for them but did not know how to respond? Some folks on our Mission Ministry Team had this happen to them so we decided to respond as Jesus taught us in the story of the Good Samaritan. We found an idea to help folks do this. A Homeless Blessing Bag is an item folks can keep in their cars or backpacks to




give to a homeless person you see while visiting or traveling through a neighborhood. The bags will be available to anyone who thinks they may want to be prepared to help the homeless. We will also have information available for folks who may want to make their own blessing bags.

**Fill the Barn by Christmas!** We know that "Jesus is the reason for the season"--Christmas isn't about the gifts we receive, it's not about the Christmas cookies, or even the beautiful decorations. Christmas is about the birth of Jesus, Emmanuel, "God is with us". However, in the culture in which we live, it's easy to get swept up in consumerism and the buy, buy, buy mentality. This is why Zion's always offers alternative giving opportunities; opportunities for us to participate in God's work in this world, and to share the love of Jesus, the gift of God for us.

One such opportunity will be the "Angel Tree", where you can take a tag and purchase the listed item for an individual in our local community. We are matched with these families through Jonestown Elementary and this is a great way to spread the joy of Christmas locally.



Another opportunity is to help us "Fill the Barn by Christmas" by 'purchasing' animals for families



around the world who live in poverty. Through the ELCA's "Good Gifts" program, this money will provide training, tools, and animals for food and business (milk and eggs can be sold), which can provide for a family's needs for a long time. To participate, between now and Christmas, place your donation marked "World Hunger" or "Barn" in the offering plate. For reference, a dozen chicks cost \$10, a rooster is \$15, a piglet is \$30, a goat is \$50, and a cow is \$500. Beginning with the children's sermon on Advent 1, we will bring forward animal(s) that represent the amount of money raised (while singing "Friendly Beasts"!), with the goal of "Filling the Barn" by Christmas. This is a tangible way to remember the Christmas story

and share the HOPE of Christmas with our neighbors around the world. We will also have cards available if you'd like to let someone know that you've purchased an animal in their honor.



### **Worship Notes and Changes**

Communion Bread Update: For several years, we have used gluten free communion bread for the entire congregation. Each week, a lot of bread from the sliced loaf is left over and doesn't hold together well enough to be used the following week. Because of this, we are returning to standard (gluten containing) bread for the congregation, with gluten free wafers available for those who need that accommodation. When intinction is used, the whole congregation will receive gluten free wafers.

**Nursery Update:** Unfortunately, we are not offering a staffed nursery at this point in time. We have created a "Break Space" in the Gathering Area, near the TV, to be used by young children and their parents when and if they need a break from worship. There are some quiet toys there for your use.

# It's that time of year...time to submit requests for money from our Touching Tomorrow Endowment Fund!

### What is the purpose of the "Touching Tomorrow" Endowment fund?

The Endowment Fund distributes money, in the form of grants, for mission and outreach beyond the normal church budget and usually, beyond the church walls. The aim of such grants is to "Touch Tomorrow," allowing for present and future ministry.

### Who oversees the Touching Tomorrow Fund?

A Touching Tomorrow Committee oversees the Fund. This committee meets annually to decide expenditures based on the financial performance of the account and the specific requests. These purchases are not approved by council, but council approves the members of the committee. The committee currently consists of Jim Cascarino, Jim Gill (Chair), Terry Ludwig, Michelle Bucks, and Christine Techky. If you'd like to help, please see Jim Gill or Pastor Caitlin.

#### Where does the money come from in the Touching Tomorrow Fund?

The original money came from a large bequest to the church. Currently the fund has roughly \$420,000 in principal investments, which includes the original gift, but also later gifts and interest added to principal. Each year grants come from the interest and dividends on the account. These have varied over time. The hope is that in the future, more people will consider giving money, either in honor of loved ones, or as part of their estate planning, to the Touching Tomorrow Fund.

#### How can I contribute to the Touching Tomorrow Fund?

Gifts of any size are greatly appreciated, and you may benefit from significant tax advantages. By using a combination of certain financial and insurance products, you can even leave a bigger inheritance to your loved ones while preserving your desired gift to the fund. For more information on this strategy, you may consult your estate attorney or talk with Jim Gill, Zion's representative from Thrivent Financial.

### What kind of things has the Touching Tomorrow Fund supported?

Between 2006 and 2018, the Fund distributed over \$135,000 to various projects, including:
Seed money for launching Zion's Preschool; continued scholarships for preschool families in need
Donation to Lutheran Social Services of Northern California to help victims displaced by wildfires
Support for a handful of local charities, including helping to fund a forklift for Lebanon County Christian Ministries

Subsidized the cost of Zion's Day Camp, making it an affordable option for families in our community Support for Halcyon Activity Center, a local drop-in center for adults with mental disabilities Assistance for local families in need, including a Zion's family with unexpected medical bills Funds for the Lower Susquehanna's food packing event at synod assembly Support of Brittney's Hope in Vietnam Contribution to Developmental and Disability Services in Lebanon County

#### What kind of money is available for grants this year?

While the fund's investments are conservative, fluctuations in the stock market means we will not know the exact amount of the distribution until closer to December 1. Last year we were able to distribute over \$14,700; we hope this year for another generous distribution.

#### How can you make a request for a project?

Simple: Fill out the front of this paper by Dec 1, 2019! The most successful applications tend to benefit educational ministries (scholarships, youth group, leadership training), local ministries (innovative congregational ministries, seed money, or emergency appeals), extended ministries (national, international, disaster-related), and charities with specific needs.
