Dear Members and Friends of Zion's:

As you will soon hear at our annual congregational meeting, one of our Council priorities for this year is "sharing the story" of God's work in and through Zion's. As Pastor, I am involved in most of the ministries that happen at Zion's, which means I often get a front row seat to the "God stories" that happen all the time. It's an awesome and a holy privilege. And over the year, I've come to understand that being 'curator', or caretaker, of these stories needs to be one of my priorities as your pastor. For it is so important that we be able to name, claim, and share the many ways God is working through us to love, care for, and redeem this world. At the same time, God has only given me two eyes, two ears, and one mouth: which are incapable of capturing and sharing all the stories that happen in and through our congregation. So, for newsletter articles this year I'm turning the story-telling reins over to members of our Council who will share a portion of their God story (how they understand God to be working in their lives), and some of how they experience *our* God story (where they see God at work in our congregation). I hope you enjoy this opportunity to get to know our congregational leaders better, and how they experience God. But, for one more month, here's a piece of God's story, through my eyes and ears and words:

What brought you to Zion's, and how long have you been attending? The Holy Spirit brought me to Zion's! Through a congregational call vote in July 2016.

What keeps you here? I believe the Spirit is *still* calling me to serve among you as Pastor and am also very grateful that the Spirit has created a place for my family (spouse Seth and daughter Madelyn) to belong and grow in faith.

Share a favorite memory of a worship service or event here. Madelyn's baptism is a favorite memory, as is the very first worship service we attended as a family of three. These are memorable because they both afforded me the rare opportunity to worship in the pew with my family. I also really value the Sundays where our children and youth prepare and lead worship—it is so awesome to watch them grow into these roles, and to fill them with such joy and enthusiasm.

Share your favorite hymn/Bible verse/Bible story. My favorite verse for the past decade or so has been 1 Cor 13:12 "For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known." This verse reminds me that I am called to serve faithfully, day to day, making the best decisions I can based on the information and time available—knowing that we will never see the *whole* picture, until that day we are united face to face with God. This verse calls me to humble trust in God, who alone sees the whole picture.

Share about a time God seemed especially present with you. I'll never forget the time I was in China, helping open a healing home for babies born with cleft lip and palate and we had to send a child (with a heart defect) back to her orphanage, knowing she would soon die. I was overwhelmed with God's promise that there is "nowhere we can go to flee from God's presence", and had to fully trust that God knew this baby and her needs, was holding her now in God's loving arms, and would embrace her through all eternity.

What's the one ministry at Zion's you always share with others? (Or a time you were especially proud of how Zion's lived in response to God's call) I love our Rejoicing Spirits ministry, and am always glad to share it with others. It's such an informal, joy-filled evening that I find it's easy to invite others to participate because I *know* they will experience the love of God when they walk through the doors on a Wednesday night. Plus, everyone needs to eat!

What do you think God is calling our congregation towards? I believe God is calling each of us, individually and as a congregation, to deeper discipleship: to knowing God's story (scripture) better, so we can see its intersection with our lives more clearly, and, ultimately, interpret our lives through the call of scripture. Whether one has been a Christian her whole life, or is just beginning the journey, I absolutely believe we are all always called to grow in faith, and I pray our congregation continues to take that call seriously.


Dear Zions,

Council Highlights from December, 2019 meeting

- Extensive discussion continues around Stewardship at Zions, the importance of intentional giving, and our plans for 2020.
- Council approved the use of up to \$2000 from the Memorial Fund for the 5-year load test and annual inspection of our elevator.
- Approved a \$80,000 Capital Campaign, tentatively entitled "Restore, Renew, Remain for Generations to come", to be sent to the congregation for approval at the January congregational meeting. This includes replacing three AC units in the sanctuary at \$8k a piece, repairing the rubber roof in the social hall for \$20k, repairing the crown moulding and painting the sanctuary for \$6k, purchasing a new heating/cooling unit for the pastor's office for \$4-5K, and paying off the \$22k that remains on the social hall loan (from when renovations were previously done)
- Received with joy the 2019 Touching Tomorrow approved endowment grants: \$360 to fund a day's worth of operations at LCCM's shelter, \$500 for the Lebanon County Envirothon, \$2000 to support Michael Johnsen as he continues in seminary, \$450 for Compeer, \$500 for Zion's Youth Group's 2021 trip, \$1000 for Habitat for Humanity projects in Lebanon and for Syrian Refugees, \$500 to create a professional video highlighting our Rejoicing Spirits ministry, \$1200 for Brittney's Hope to purchase specialized beds for four disabled children, \$4,812 to cover the principle and interest on our social hall loan for 2020, \$200 for Northern Lebanon Fire and Emergency Services, \$500 in preschool scholarships, \$450 for our Back to School Blessings event, and \$446 in seed money for the 2020 Basket Raffle-Auction.
- Elected new officers: Joanna Guldin-Noll as President, Christine Techky as Vice President, Kelly Rittle as Secretary, Cathy Houser as Treasurer, Debbie Long as Financial Secretary
- Reminded everyone that, effective January 2020, Council meetings will be at 7 PM on the THIRD MONDAY of each month.

When e-mailing them, please be sure to mention that you are part of the Zion's Lutheran, Jonestown, PA group. During this winter closure time, you will have to verify with the hotel the best way to make your deposit payment.

The Roman Holiday is offering us an opportunity to put down a \$100 deposit <u>NOW</u> to hold a room for 2020. Currently there are many 1-bedroom efficiency suite rooms. Hopefully this will make it possible for all of us from Zion's to again be able to stay at the same hotel.


