

Zion's Mission Statement: Reflecting Christ, we are called to share God's gifts

"Let it go"

These words have been ringing, singing and bouncing off the walls in my house the past few weeks. In Disney's latest hit movie, Frozen, one of the main characters sings a great song called "Let it go." Both my daughters love it and have sung it over and over again.

As much as I might tire of the song, I need to hear its key words - "Let it go"- again and again in my life. In church we often use the phrase "Let go and let God." Most of know that we should let go, giving things over to God. Yet this is quite difficult, especially when life becomes uncertain. So we need to hear this word over and over, reminding us to give life over to God.

One of the big areas of uncertainty for me right now relates to the internship program at our church. I am having some trouble letting go here!

Let me start with what is certain: Things are working out. I truly enjoy working with Vicar Daniel Clark. He has blessed our congregation and Zion Grantville. I believe we have helped him hone skills that will bless him as he begins his ordained ministry. At the end of the day, we will have to say goodbye to him. In February, he will be assigned (through an NBA-like draft) to a region of the country and then ultimately a synod (a collection of 100 to 200 congregations). Hopefully in spring he will interview with congregations and then in summer, be ordained and begin his first call. We will rejoice with him, but we will certainly miss him.

What is uncertain: Who will be our intern next year? Will we get an intern next year? What gifts but also growth areas will they bring?

This week I will submit a 16 page application for an intern, just as I did last year. I know I need to let go and totally trust God. But I wish I had control over the process or at least certainty of its outcome.

Ironically, my past should preach to me. Last year, we did not get an intern through the normal process, but a mutual friend connected me with Daniel. God provided in an amazing way. So I shouldn't be nervous or worried, right? God has provided and God will continue to provide.

"Let it go"

At this point, I actually do feel pretty good about the prospects of Zion's getting a good intern; or some other situation working itself out. But this has been a three month journey for me of letting go. I've been reminded that letting go isn't a one-time event. It's a process of God teaching me to trust him. I always need to hear God's promise, reminding me of his grace, of his presence and of his providence.

As I wrote this, the Seminary called to discuss the intern interview process. They informed me that they have 26 interns for 36 spots. I began to pace when I heard this, contemplating all sorts of plans and back-up plans. But then later that night, my daughters sang "Let it go" again. Thank God for the constant reminder in my life to trust God's providence. I -- and I think all of us -- need this every day.

Zion's Christmas Tree - You may notice the abundance of stars adorning our tree this year. These stars represent God's light to the world, Jesus Christ. Stars on our tree represent designs used around the world, such as the Polish Star with its many spikes and the Finnish star which appears woven and lacy. The German Star, also called the Froebel star (German: Fröbelstern) dates back to at least the 19th century and has been used for many years to decorate our tree, reflecting our German heritage. The Moravian Star tops the tree with its many points, symbolic of Christ's concern for all people. The Scandinavian-inspired star has eight points. The eight point star is the Star of Redemption or Regeneration and represents baptism. Eight is traditionally the number of regeneration, and thus many baptismal fonts have an octagonal base. And, if you spent December in India, you'd see hundreds of glowing stars swinging merrily from the rooftops. In the south of India, Christians make star-shaped paper lanterns called puntis (pronounced "PUN-thees") for Christmas. Like the five pointed stars on our Christmas tree, puntis represent the star of Bethlehem. The first Christmas, people followed the light of the star to Christ, and we still follow his light today. For Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)
